UMPQUA COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD MINUTES September 21, 2022

The Umpqua Community College Board of Education had a regular meeting on Wednesday, September 21, 2022, in Room 17 of Taphòytha' Hall at Umpqua Community College in Roseburg, Oregon; the meeting was live-streamed on YouTube. Board Chair Loosley called the meeting to order at 5:35 p.m. and the pledge of allegiance was given.

President Pokrandt provided a brief overview of the grant funding associated with the resolutions in the consent agenda. The consent agenda was approved by general consent. The items are attached to the permanent minutes.

Changes to the Agenda: There were no changes.

INTRODUCTIONS

New and re-positioned employees were introduced: Jacob Whisler, the new Rural Project Coordinator; he continues as the Assistant Coach for Baseball and was previously working in the Grounds department. DeLane Overton is the new Career Academy Coordinator. Joe Flora is the new Director of Facilities & Security.

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REPORTS

Association Representative: Melissa Lake was introduced as the new ACEUCC President.

President's Report – Rachel Pokrandt, Ph.D.: A brief overview was provided of the President's written report which has been posted on the Board Meetings webpage. Highlighted topics included the creation of an in-person new employee orientation; the future need for student housing (currently every available bed is full); CWT hiring a faculty member to teach Leadership Bootcamp that has industry support; UCC's capital proposal has been accepted by the state – the next step is legislature approval; the College is now the fiscal agenda for the STEAM Hub; Wolf Creek Job Corp has begun accepting staggered cohorts of students back to their facilities; the Nursing department has doubled the capacity for this year's CNA program; UCC will commemorate the Oct. 1, 2015 tragedy on Sept. 29 by doing a Day of Service to Remember; FTE is currently up by 8%; and faculty were thanked for their many contributions.

NEW BUSINESS

Jenny Friedman, UCC Part Time Faculty Association (UCCPTFA) President, and President Pokrandt requested Board ratification of the UCCPTFA collective bargaining agreement. The agreement is effective from the first day of the fall term 2022 through the last day of the summer term of 2025. Key changes to the agreement were summarized: compensation to the association president for representing the union and working collaboratively with the college; salary increase for this year and the next two years; salary step level placement for new hires; clarification of language regarding assignment of classes. Additionally, the bargaining provided an opportunity for conversations on how the College can provide better support for PT Faculty. Appreciation was expressed to Ms. Friedman and the part-time faculty.

MOTION:

I move to approve the ratification of the Part-time Faculty Association Collective Bargaining Agreement effective from the first day of the 2022 fall term through the last day of the 2025 summer term, as presented. Motion by Dir. Smith, seconded by Dir. McDonald, and unanimously approved.

Natalya Brown, Chief Financial Officer, requested Board approval to eliminate the graduation application fee effective July 1, 2022. The process was reviewed and found that it created a significant barrier to students completing the graduation process which included a degree audit. The College is looking to automate the process in the future.

MOTION:

I move to approve the elimination of the graduation application fee effective July 1, 2022, as presented. Motion by Dir. McDonald, seconded by Dir. Littlejohn, and unanimously approved.

A preview of the new website was presented by Suzi Pritchard, Director of Communications and Marketing. The anticipated launch date of the new website is by the end of the year. Ms. Pritchard also explained the efforts taken for developing the College's brand through research and synthesizing the information. Brand pillars and identity visual elements were identified. A video was shared highlighting the elements along with the College tagline, "Transform your life".

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Teresa Rivenes, Vice President Academic Services, provided an update regarding the upcoming Year 7 visit. The visit will focus on reviewing the College's policies, regulations, and financial review. Based upon the response from information already submitted, Dr. Rivenes highlighted areas that were compliant, need improvement, or need additional review. Overall, the College did well but there is still work yet to be done. The onsite visit will be in April 2023.

Board Comments:

- Appreciation was expressed for IT's help in setting up and running the meeting.
- Appreciation was expressed for the data work done by Steve Rogers.
