# UMPQUA COMMUNITY COLLEGE BOARD MINUTES October 14, 2020

The Umpqua Community College Board of Education met on October 14, 2020, in room 15 of Tap<sup>h</sup>òyt<sup>h</sup>a' Hall at Umpqua Community College in Roseburg, Oregon and via Zoom conferencing; the meeting was live-streamed on Facebook. Board Chair Loosley called the meeting to order at 4:33 p.m. and the pledge of allegiance was given.

**Citizen Comments:** Joy Yori sent an email asking if the Board will be seeking outside guidance in finalizing the presidential profile. Chair Loosley deferred answering until that topic is discussed in the meeting.

Resolution #5, Increase Appropriation, was briefly explained and added to the consent agenda. The consent agenda was approved by general consent. The items are attached to the permanent minutes.

Changes to the Agenda – there were none.

#### REPORTS

- ASUCC Kamilah Mirza, President: A written report was submitted.
- **OCCA Dir. Lathrop:** A written report was submitted. Participation was encouraged in the upcoming OCCA annual conference.
- **President Dr. Thatcher:** The oral report focused on an overview of three topics: launch of fall term, accreditation timeline, and Lockwood Hall renovation plan. The written report will be posted to the Board meeting webpage.
- Accreditation The written report was submitted.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Chair Loosley read the presidential profile draft that had been discussed during the work session prior to the meeting. The Board previously decided to run its own search for a president. The profile, a component of the search, is like a job advertisement that highlights the qualities and attributes desired in the next president. Feedback from the recent community survey was used in the development of the profile. Input on the profile was received from Board members. The draft profile will be edited and finalized in the next few days. It will be posted on the Presidential Search webpage in the upcoming week.

# MOTION: I move to approve the Presidential Profile draft to be used for the President Search with the recommended changes, as presented. Motion by Dir. Mills, seconded by Dir. Kennerly. Approved by Directors Kennerly, Littlejohn, McDonald, Mills, Richardson, and Loosley; Dir. Lathrop abstained. The Presidential Profile was approved.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Natalya Brown, Chief Financial Officer, presented and reviewed the Budget Calendar for Fiscal Year 2021-2022. Since this is a new biennium year, the adoption of the budget has been pushed to June 2021 to allow for legislative information about the state allocation. The Budget Calendar is an information item.

The College requested Board guidance for parameters to be used in the 2021-2022 budget development process. College administration will incorporate the Board's recommendations into the set of assumptions with a goal of producing a balanced budget. President Thatcher reviewed a PowerPoint presentation that addressed uncertain state allocations, multiple budget scenarios, deferred maintenance budget, deferred maintenance savings, deferred maintenance needs, strategic initiatives, innovation fund, instructional fee, comparison to other colleges, tuition and fees, tuition and fees increases, and tuition and fees possibilities.

After discussion, the overall thoughts were summarized:

- Deferred maintenance strong support; especially if matching state funds are available
- Strategic fund strong support for forward thinking and innovative fund
- Instruction Fee the Board was neutral and didn't express support for the fee or ask for the fee to be reconsidered
- Tuition be mindful of a tuition increase since students have many opportunities for online education; try to hold this year or have a small increase

Policies were presented for a first reading. President Thatcher provided a clarification of 5510 Off-Campus Student Organizations. Dir. Lathrop will share an edit, for 5070 Attendance, with Robynne Wilgus.

President Thatcher will introduce Dr. Dina M. Battaglia, the new Director of Faculty Development.					
Dr. Dina M. Battaglia celebrates 22 years working in academic affa					

developer and five as a department chair when teaching full-time as an associate professor of psychology. As our new Director of Faculty Development, Dr. Battaglia joins us from Arizona where her immediate family still resides. A graduate of both Arizona State University (B.S. Psychology & Honors College/*Summa Cum Laude*) and Texas Christian University (M.S.& Ph.D. in General Experimental Psychology/Social Psychology), she has enjoyed 16 years of teaching as a full-time faculty member. When serving as department chair, she redesigned and rebuilt a failing psychology program into one of the most thriving academic programs on campus. For the past seven years, Dr. Battaglia has found her passion working in the field of educational development beginning at the (formerly named) Faculty Center for Innovative Teaching at Central Michigan University and more recently as the Director of the Center for Teaching and Learning Excellence (CTLE) at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (Prescott, Arizona). In her role as Director of CTLE, she created a fully developed teaching and learning center from ground zero.

She is an active member of the Professional and Organizational Development Network in Higher Education (POD), the International Society for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning, as well as EDUCAUSE. Her primary interest in the scholarship of teaching and learning (SoTL) is self-determination theory, learning spaces, and applying theories of positive psychology to student learning. Dr. Battaglia has a proven track record in SoTL, both nationally and internationally. She has presented her research at teaching and learning conferences in Norway, The Netherlands, Australia, Canada, and if not for COVID, Switzerland. Furthermore, she served upon invitation as an inaugural member of the editorial board for *The Scholarly Teacher: Applying Evidenced-Based Strategies to Enrich Student Learning*. And, in 2017, she was awarded the highly competitive *Steelcase Education Active Learning Center Grant*. Dr. Battaglia believes we each have a shared responsibility in serving our students each and every day to assure student learning is achieved.

Her best friend is her dog Granite. She loves most sports, football especially, bicycle riding, the Oregon Coast, beer and wine tasting, and meditation exercises after a long day. She, her partner, and Granite live in Sutherlin and are VERY happy to call Oregon home.
