Trevon Anspach Memorial Station


The station will be located just north of the intersection of Hwy 99N and Umpqua College Rd.

The station currently serves UCC and is 1 mile from campus

Oregon State Police office is next door

Location along Interstate 5 will allow for quick response to assist departments around Douglas County

Location on Interstate 5 will allow opportunity for advertisement for the Fire Science & Paramedic programs



Trevon Anspach Memorial Station

- ♦ The 2 bays to the north will be the student station.
- Introducing a resident program will allow recruitment of students both local and from outside Douglas County
- ♦ It will host our student staffed fire engine
- ♦ It will allow for quick response to learn along side our career staff
- ♦ It will also host a support van
- The support van could be utilized to assist other departments in Douglas County
- ♦ This side of station will be equipped with dorms and kitchen for the students



Trevon Anspach Memorial Station




- ♦ The middle of the station will hold administration offices for the Fire District
- ♦ It will have a classroom, conference room and workout facility to be shared by career duty crews and students
- ♦ The south 4 bays will be the new home of our Winchester crew.
- ♦ That crew will be working with an ambulance, engine, brush co and possibly water tender

On shift the students are mentored in all aspects of training






They are trained to be able to operate seamlessly with our duty crews
