#### **Graduation Rates Overview**

Many student are completing this application while still in high school, before they've had an opportunity to meet with one of our advisors, and, when faced with a list of 70+ choices for program of study, often just select "undecided". Now, we still check the student's application for admission, but also look at the program of study they choose after meeting with an advisor. This captures better data about each student's degree intent, but is also the reason this count is higher and was flagged by the IPEDS system.
