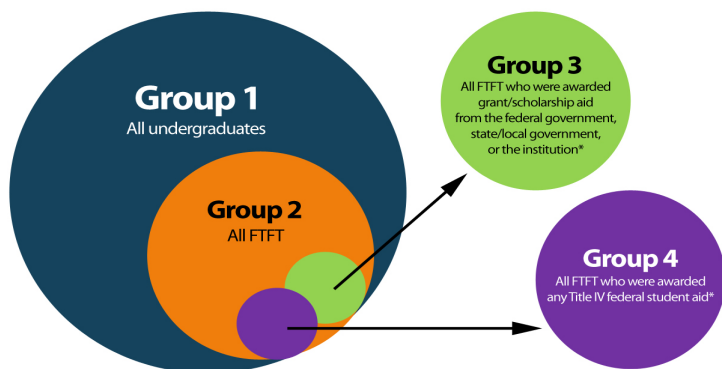
### Overview

- College Affordability and Transparency Lists
