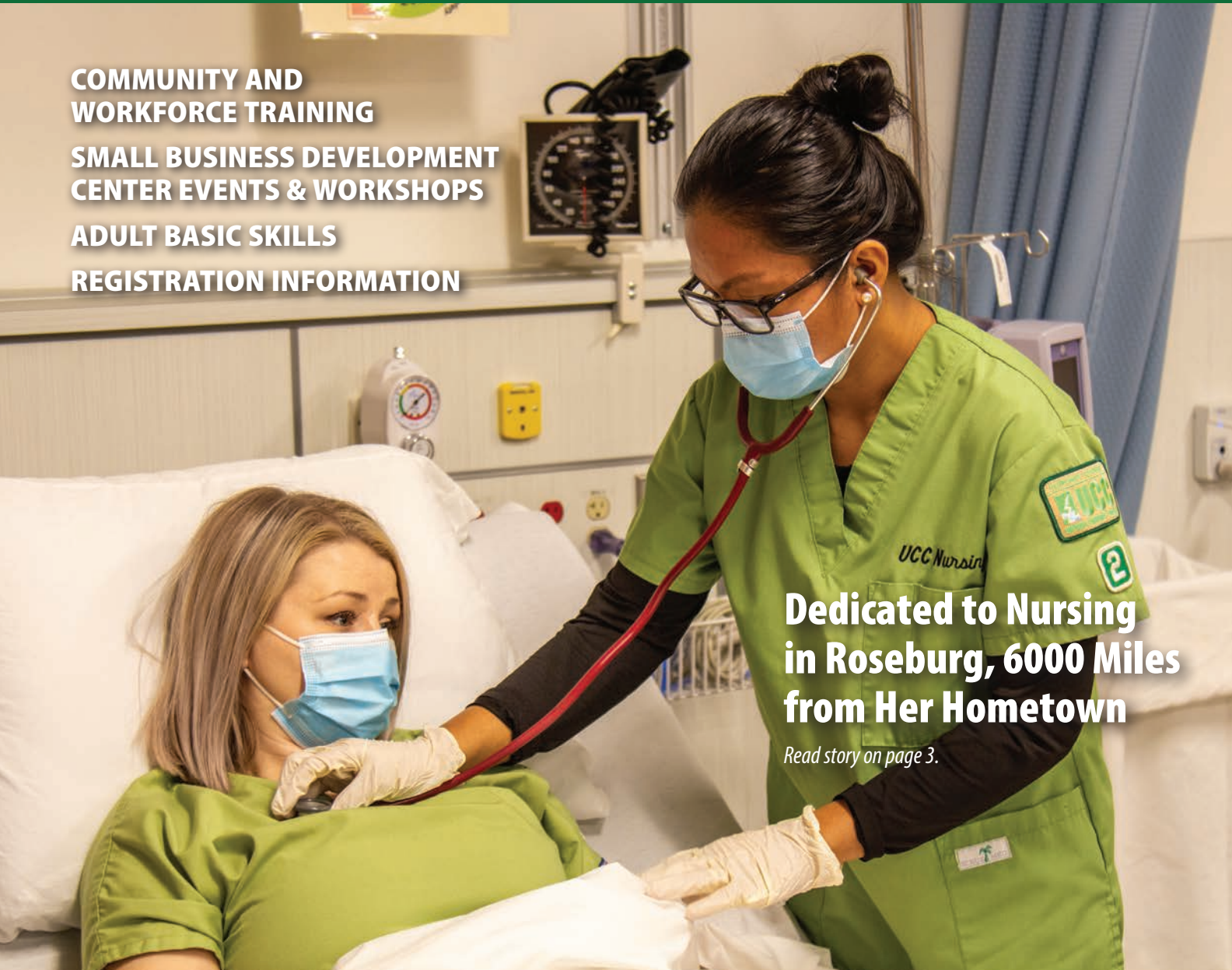

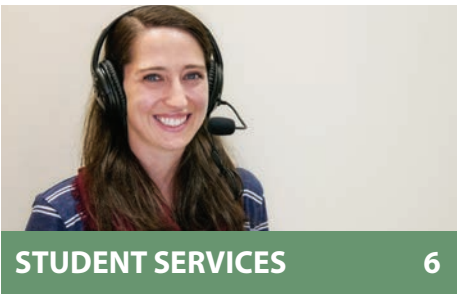

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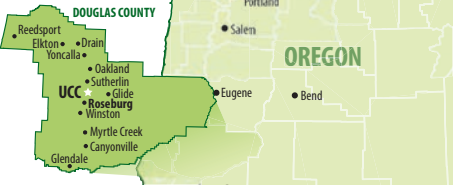

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SPOTLIGHT ON STUDENT SUCCESS

Dedicated to Nursing in Roseburg 6,000 Miles from Home

Analyn McCoy, a nursing student at Umpqua Community College (UCC), was born and raised in the Philippines. She grew up with very limited resources; not even having access to basic commodities such as water, electricity, and medical care.

In 2005, Analyn came to the United States to join her husband and start a new life in California, and in 2011 moved to Roseburg. She began her first job as a caregiver. It was there she discovered her passion for helping other people, especially the elderly.

"I love taking care of other people. I've always have. When I was a kid, I told my grandma that when she got older, I would take care of her. That was my promise to her," McCoy said.

Unfortunately, Analyn's grandmother passed away. Though she was not able to take care of her grandma as promised; becoming a nurse, she would be able take care of other people, especially the elderly in her grandmother's honor.

"UCC is the first college I have ever experienced in my life that supports students, and personalizes each student's concerns. The instructors and advisors at UCC are there for us and they are willing to sit one-to-one to help students to be successful. You just need to ask them and they are more than willing to help you."

After almost two decades of living in the US, McCoy has never taken things for granted. Her childhood in poverty helps her to look at life differently than other people. "I did not realize that I had a hard life when I was growing up until I compared it to my life now. It is really a big difference," McCoy said. "I was 24

years old when I came to the U.S. All these years I did not regret all that I have gone through in life instead I value them."

After moving to Roseburg, McCoy quickly progressed from being a caregiver to finding a career path to becoming a nurse. UCC enabled her to study and advance her knowledge. As an immigrant, English and Math had been barriers in her college journey. But with motivation and support from her instructors and advisors, she received her Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) certificate and is now a second-year nursing student at UCC. McCoy has bigger plans for her career, her next step is to pursue a Bachelor's degree in nursing through the Oregon Transfer Degree program. She is hoping to work on the Progressive Care Unit floor where she can provide the most support by using knowledge and skills she has learned at UCC.

"Getting my nursing degree here at UCC will double my current salary. It will help tremendously"

McCoy also works part-time at Mercy Hospital and juggles in a busy family life while taking care of her own children. In 2021, McCoy was given First Year Registered Nursing Outstanding Student award by the UCC Nursing faculty.

"The nursing program at UCC is really awesome. The instructors are always there to help me. Last year, for example, I know it was really hard for everybody when the pandemic first hit. Many schools were closed but UCC was able to open the school, the clinical part where nursing students were able to continue clinical practice and outreach. UCC accommodates students' needs and they facilitate us to be successful."

Short-term Medical Trainings Lead to Industry Certifications

From the department of Community & Workforce Training

Demand for medical workers is at an all-time high. According to the 2020 Industry Outlook, 90% of employers encourage certification over job training alone for occupations such as phlebotomy, pharmacy technician, and medical assistant.

Umpqua Community College has trained hundreds of people as entry-level medical workers for over a decade, helping them go from trainee to employment in as little as three to six months.

Q.

How has the certification for Medical Assistant and Phlebotomy Training increased career opportunities?

A.

Over the last 18 months, UCC has aligned our Medical Assistant and Phlebotomy Training with the National Healthcareer Association (NHA), the largest allied health certification agency in the United States. At completion, students earn an NHA certification recognized in all 50 states, in addition to the state-recognized Noncredit Training Certificate. NHA certifications are highly valued by students and employers.



Q.

What opportunities do students have to practice skills in the workplace?

A.

The combination of curriculum, practical skill-building, and a certification exam lead to a portable recognized credential. Cristina Madeja-Carreon, a UCC alumnus, chose UCC over another Oregon Community College because of the NHA Certified Phlebotomy Technician (CPT) offered. Her family was planning to move to South Carolina, and she wanted training that would be recognized in another state and give her a leg up when applying for a job. Cristina currently works as a phlebotomist at a plasma center.

Even with the limited duration of the class, UCC partners with several employers to offer experience in the workplace. A clinical experience at CHI Mercy Medical Center, Umpqua Health-Newton Creek, Cancer Center, ADAPT Crossroads and Southern River Community Health Center, Evergreen Family Medicine, or Canyonville Health and Urgent Care can lead to a job offer. Emma Bannister, a phlebotomy student, shared, "The class provided many hands-on opportunities for me to practice skills needed which helped me acquire a job as a phlebotomist and lab assistant at CHI Mercy." Emma is using this certification, in conjunction with her Oregon State University science degree and experience in a hospital setting to assist, as she works toward completing an MLS degree and becoming a Medical Laboratory Scientist.

Jessica Coker earned her CCMA (Medical Assistant) certification in spring 2021 after completing 200 hours of training and clinical experience and passing the certification exam. NHA certifications



are stackable, and Jessica plans to take the spring 2022 phlebotomy class to add another tool in her tool belt of employable skills. Jessica credits the amazing instructors and staff who helped her find a way, even when she didn't think it was possible. Instructor and 38-year-old veteran of the phlebotomy field, Cathie Parker, explains, "Phlebotomy can take you so many places and the career opportunities are amazing."

Q.

Do students have the opportunity to add any additional certifications?

A.

UCC incorporates NHA certification with our phlebotomy and medical assistant training, with plans to add Certified Pharmacy Technician (CPhT) certification to our existing pharmacy technician training in 2023. The results thus far have been impressive. All students who have taken the NHA exam after completing their training have passed. Phlebotomy student Lindsay Clark is grateful for the opportunity she was given and said, "The instructors strive to help you gain the correct tools and guidance to succeed in the workplace. This program made a huge impact in my life."

F2F (Face to Face)

In-person class at a physical location. Good for hands-on learning.



Remote

Live instructor-led class delivered online at a specified day and time.



Online

Self-guided learning. Instructor availability. Best for self-starters.



Blended

In-person class on campus with online options when a student is unable to attend.

GED, Pre-GED, ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACQUISITION AND SKILL REVIEW

Umpqua Community College is dedicated to assisting adults who want and need to develop strong basic academic skills in reading, grammar, writing, spelling and mathematics.

ADULT BASIC SKILLS (ABS) PROGRAMS INCLUDE:

- Adult Basic Education (ABE) and Pre-GED
- GED, College, and Career Preparation
- Skill Review
- English Language Acquisition (ELA)

SKILL REVIEW

- Skill Review is for students who have finished high school or completed their GED, but still need further instruction to improve their skills for college or work.

ADULT HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

- These classes are for students over 18 years of age, or released from high school, and needing 3 or fewer credits to complete their diploma.
- Cost is \$25 per .5 credit, plus \$2 technology fee.

ELA ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACQUISITION (Learn English!)

ELA offers beginning and intermediate level English classes for adults. Classes are offered in the evenings and are available to join in-person or remotely via a computer.

Students will receive instruction in speaking, reading, writing, listening, and basic computer skills in a fun, safe atmosphere.

- Classes focus primarily on language skills for the workplace. Students who have intermediate to advanced ELA skills may also be eligible to sign up for ABE, pre-GED, and GED classes.
- ELA class cost is \$18, plus a \$2 technology fee.

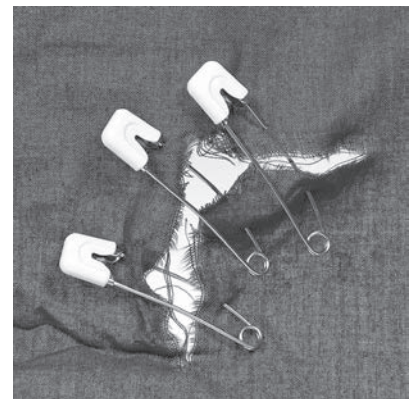

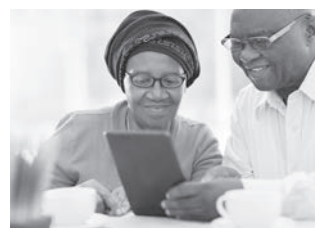

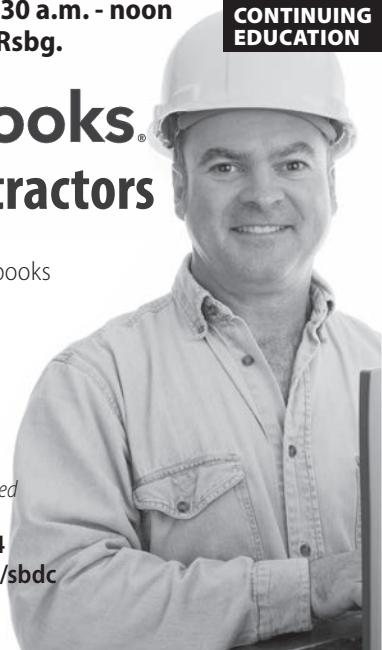

TUITION AND FEES

STUDENT FEES

At UCC a student may be required to pay for fees in addition to tuition. Credit classes require some “per credit” fees; term fees are charged each term; and course fees are associated with a specific class.

ATHLETIC FEE

Supports student engagement in athletic events, utilization of the athletic facilities (fitness center, pool during open swim).

COURSE FEES

Course fees pay for the materials and supplies associated with the class you are taking (ie: lab supplies for a Science class or liability insurance for Nursing). Some courses are offered as self support and carry a fee amount that is required for course delivery and/or materials.

CREDIT REGISTRATION FEE

This fee is charged each term to students who enroll in 7 undergraduate credit classes. The proceeds go toward placement testing, degree/certificate application process, academic transcripts, degree verifications, and other record keeping.

INSTRUCTIONAL FEES

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the costs associated with labs and lecture/lab class formats.

LEGACY FEE

The fee will be used to fund new construction on campus and deferred maintenance on existing buildings.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee helps fund the operations of the Student Life office and supports student activities (including athletics). The fee funds the college contract with Umpqua Transit, which provides credit students with a reduced priced bus pass for the term.

STUDENT FEE FOR SUCCESS PROGRAM

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the Success Center and Peer Mentor program.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

Provides for the upkeep and renewal of campus technology infrastructure in support of classrooms, computer labs, and campus information systems.

UCCONLINE & HYBRID CLASS FEES

Fees pay for costs associated with providing students with online courses, including the delivery platform.

WHO MAY ENROLL?

UCC has an open door policy and admits students in the following categories:

- Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old who are not required to attend high school and who furnish a written Release from Compulsory School Attendance may make application as a special student (ORS 339.030)
- High school juniors or seniors who present written approval from their school officials. (Course load must be approved by both schools)
- Some programs have special program requirements other than listed above

Citizens of other countries must meet certain federal immigration and college requirements before admittance to Umpqua Community College. International students can request special application materials from the UCC website. Students are required to attend an orientation. Non-credit students are not required to submit a formal application.
