This publication has a brand new look. What was once called the UCC quarterly class schedule is now called UCC Community Connections.







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SPOTLIGHT ON STUDENT SUCCESS

Learning Through a Different Lens



"Communicating effectively was really hard for me. I decided to go back to school because I wanted to improve my English." - Sophavid Choum-Starkey

Many people take the ability to communicate in English for granted. Reading, writing, and speaking English are just things most people who live in Douglas County can easily do. But for some people, it takes a great deal of effort and determination to even begin to learn English. For nearly two years, Sophavid Choum-Starkey has been learning through a different lens. What started as a simple goal to fit in with the community has led the Umpqua Community College (UCC) student to find her purpose and direction in life. Sophavid's journey to Oregon was less than traditional. She was born in Cambodia — a country that endured the Khmer Rouge Regime in the late half of the 1970s. During that time, around two million Cambodians

starved to death or were executed. Sophavid's parents survived. Following the regime's reign, they continued to live as farmers. Dedicated to raising their crops and animals, they never completed school. Today, their educational dreams live in their children.

"My dad is really happy I am doing this because he also didn't get a chance to do it," she said. "He always wanted his children to do better, so he is proud of my decision."

About 10 years ago, Sophavid played video games. In her words, it was something she "tried and did as a kid." During that time, she worked at a nonprofit organization in Cambodia that helped restore sight to the blind; video games were simply a hobby. While playing, she happened to

connect with a man who lived in California. Over the course of several years, the two became friends. He taught her English and helped her with writing. One day, he asked her a question.

"I was driving down the road and he asked me to marry him," she said. "He had asked me a few times before and I thought he was kidding. But this time, I finally said yes."

By the time they got married in 2018, her husband had moved back home to Roseburg. After joining him here, the culture shock hit. For the next six months, Sophavid stayed in her house. One day, a class schedule from UCC arrived in her mailbox. She discovered UCC's Woolley Center and its English Language Acquisition (ELA) courses inside.

"I had difficulty talking to people," she said. "Communicating effectively was really hard for me. I decided to go back to school because I wanted to improve my English."

Sophavid discovered a lot more than language skills at the Woolley Center's Harvard Avenue location. A pre-test showed she was beyond ELA courses; she was ready to work on a GED. While the price was right for her at \$20 per class, what she needed next was courage and a lot of it.

"I cried on my first day of writing class because I didn't know about many things in this country," she said. "I only knew about America through movies at that time. For me to blend into the culture, I needed an understanding and the GED program helped me do that."

Finding her Voice in Journalism



In the winter of 2017, Renee Thompson joined Umpqua Community College's student newspaper, *The Mainstream*, as a reporter and graphic designer. Thompson, an art, advertising, and psychology major, was dissatisfied with the information she learned about advertising in a business course. When friends and teachers suggested she consider taking a journalism course to fill her desire for advertising knowledge, she was hesitant at first.

"It wasn't until my partner Logan suggested we take it together that I finally got the courage to sign up," Thompson said. "I [was] diagnosed with anxiety at 18, so going into college there were a lot of things I had to change for my own well-being."

As part of *The Mainstream team*, Thompson worked closely with a group of fellow students to produce bi-monthly publications for UCC's campus. Through her experiences as a student journalist and with encouragement from adviser Melinda Benton, Thompson was able to connect with a community of peers, increase her confidence, and find her voice.

"I was hesitant at first because I'm kind of a shy person," Thompson said. "The thought of making something that was going to be seen by that many people intimidated me a little. But after meeting Melinda, I knew it was the right place for me."

After taking one term of journalism, Thompson fell in love with writing and took another journalism course, Introduction to Mass Communication, in spring 2017. She continued to work for *The Mainstream* until she graduated in spring 2018.

Part of an award-winning team, Thompson covered a variety of subjects from comic books to students' financial concerns, including the first-ever special edition on the #MeToo movement.

"I felt that it was a subject we needed to talk about," she said. "I did a story on male survivors of sexual violence and it was really interesting to be working with so many awesome writers. I remember going around the table at our first meeting and talking about all our ideas. It really taught me that journalism can be a powerful commentator on the world around us." Thompson was accepted to the University of Oregon in spring 2018. She has continued her studies there in advertising, journalism, and psychology. She currently works as the copy editor for U of O's Art Ducko Magazine and recently got a job at Green Eugene Magazine, which she attributes to taking UCC's iournalism courses.

"I couldn't be more grateful I took the class, because there really is no better way to improve your writing and design skills than jumping into projects headfirst," she said. "It's important to train reporters to be unbiased and report how facts are established in order to positively influence the world, even if it's on a small scale. I would say that media literacy and learning how to read critically are some of the most important skills a person can learn." She encourages others to "take journalism classes because [they] can teach [people] how to think critically about all the media they'll come into contact with [during] their academic careers."

Through the program, Sophavid's confidence grew. She learned about government, American history, economics, and much more.

"The benefit of a GED as an immigrant was crucial," she said. "All of it gave me the contextual information about this country that I needed."

After completing the GED program in one year, Sophavid immediately enrolled at UCC as a degree-seeking student. She also applied for a job as a work-study student and became instantly immersed in UCC's Office of Communications and Marketing, where she continues to expand her writing and speaking skills.

"I get to learn so much more in my job that I did not expect," she said. "I always learn about technology, digital marketing, writing, and photography. On top of doing our jobs and being busy, we always help students, too. This experience helps me see a better future. It's not the money [I earn] that keeps me going. This is where I can strengthen my skills and see myself in the future." While Sophavid continues with her studies and dedicates time to her work, her parents and husband continue to support her efforts to grow and earn a college degree. "I am not only doing this for myself. I am doing this for them, too, because they did not get to," she said. "Going

to college gave me sense of purpose and direction. Through this journey, I have been evolving. When I see others going through the same things I went through, I can now reach out and let them know what's available."

ADULT BASIC SKILLS (ABS) PROGRAMS INCLUDE:

- Adult Basic Education (ABE) and Pre-GED
- GED, College, and Career Preparation
- Skill Review
- English Language Acquisition (ELA)

Students in the program can take advantage of free tutoring, a school-to-career program, and several computer labs.

ORIENTATION FOR ABS CLASSES

STUDENTS INTERESTED IN TAKING AN ABS CLASS MUST FIRST ATTEND AN ORIENTATION.

During orientation, students fill out registration paperwork, set goals, learn about program options, and complete a basic skills assessment.

All Classes are currently being offered as Online Courses with Virtual Led Instruction (VLI) support provided.

ADULT BASIC EDUCATION (ABE) AND PRE-GED

Adult Basic Education and Pre-GED classes provide instruction in basic skills up through High Intermediate Basic Education level.

- Group classes and individual lessons are available in reading, grammar, writing, spelling, and mathematics.
- After students increase their reading level, they can transfer into more advanced classes, including GED, college, and career preparation classes.
- ABE and Pre-GED class cost is \$18, plus a \$2 technology fee.

CAREER PREPARATION

For adults who have not yet completed high school, UCC provides classes to prepare students to enter college or the workplace, while also preparing to pass the GED.

- The classes focus instruction on literacy, mathematics, and analytical thinking— the skills necessary to be successful on the GED, college, and at work.
- GED class and College and Career Preparation class cost is \$18, plus a \$2 technology fee.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACQUISITION (ELA)

Adults who need to learn to speak, listen to, read, and write English must attend an orientation before they can sign up for classes. Based on skills, students are placed into either beginning or intermediate level classes, and receive instruction in speaking, reading, writing, and listening to English.

- Classes focus primarily on language skills for the workplace.
 Students who have intermediate to advanced ELA skills may also be eligible to sign up for ABE, pre-GED, and GED classes.
- ELA class cost is \$18, plus a \$2 technology fee.

SKILL REVIEW

A student who has finished high school or completed their GED, but still needs further instruction to improve their skills for college or work, should sign up for a Skill Review class.

- These classes are designed to help students improve their college placement test scores prior to taking college classes or to be better prepared for the workplace.
- Skill review class cost is \$18, plus a \$2 technology fee.







TUITION AND FEES

STUDENT FEES

At UCC a student may be required to pay for fees in addition to tuition. Credit classes require some "per credit" fees; term fees are charged each term; and course fees are associated with a specific class.

COURSE FEES

Course fees pay for the materials and supplies associated with the class you are taking (ie: lab supplies for a Science class or liability insurance for Nursing). Some courses are offered as self support and carry a fee amount that is required for course delivery and materials.

CREDIT REGISTRATION FEE

This fee is charged each term to students who enroll in undergraduate credit classes. The proceeds go toward placement testing, degree/certificate application process, academic transcripts, degree verifications, and other record keeping.

INSTRUCTIONAL FEES

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the costs associated with labs and lecture/lab class formats.

LEGACY FEE

The fee will be used to fund new construction on campus and deferred maintenance on existing buildings.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee helps fund the operations of the Student Life office and supports student activities (including athletics). The fee funds the college contract with Umpqua Transit, which provides credit students with a reduced priced bus pass for the term.

STUDENT FEE FOR SUCCESS PROGRAM

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the Success Center and Peer Mentor program.

STUDENT INSURANCE FEE

This fee covers the premium for accident insurance while students are involved in college classes and activities, or traveling on college business. For more information, contact the Student Life Office at 541-440-7749.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

Provides for the upkeep and renewal of campus technology infrastructure in support of classrooms, computer labs, and campus information systems.


WHO MAY ENROLL?

UCC has an open door policy and admits students in the following categories:


• Graduates from accredited secondary schools.

- Individuals who have earned the GED Certificate of Equivalency or an Adult High School Diploma.
- Non-high school graduates who are 18 years old or over and whose high school class has graduated.
- Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old who are not required to attend high school and who furnish a written Release from Compulsory School Attendance may make application as a special student (ORS 339.030).
- High school juniors or seniors who present written approval from their school officials. (Course load must be approved by both schools.)
- Some programs have special program requirements other than listed above.

Citizens of other countries must meet certain federal immigration and college requirements before admittance to Umpqua Community College. International students can request special application materials from the UCC website. Adult Basic Skills. Students are required to attend an orientation. Non-credit students are not required to submit a formal application.
