GENERAL INFORMATION

STUDENT FEES

At UCC a student may be required to pay for fees in addition to tuition. Credit classes require some “per credit” fees; term fees are charged each term; and course fees are associated with a specific class.

Student Activity Fee

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee helps fund the operations of the Student Life office and supports student activities (including athletics). The fee funds the college contract with Umpqua Transit, which provides credit students with a reduced priced bus pass for the term.

Student Fee for SUCCESS Program

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the Success Center and Peer Mentor program.

Technology Fee

Provides for the upkeep and renewal of campus technology infrastructure in support of classrooms, computer labs, and campus information systems.

Legacy Fee

The fee will be used to fund new construction on campus and deferred maintenance on existing buildings.

Credit Registration Fee

This fee is charged each term to students who enroll in undergraduate credit classes. The proceeds go toward placement testing, degree/certificate application process, academic transcripts, degree verifications, and other record keeping.

Student Insurance Fee

This fee covers the premium for accident insurance while students are involved in college classes and activities, or traveling on college business. For more information, contact the Student Life Office at 541-440-7749.

UCC Online & Hybrid Class Fees

Fees pay for costs associated with providing students with online courses, including the delivery platform.

Course Fees

Course fees pay for the materials & supplies associated with the class you are taking (ie: lab supplies for a Science class or liability insurance for Nursing). Some courses are offered as self support and carry a fee amount that is required for course delivery and materials.

CREDIT TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees are payable by the deadline listed for each term. Tuition and fee rates are subject to change without prior notice. Increases are anticipated for 2017-18.

All veterans and their eligible dependents pay in-state tuition rates in compliance with Section 702 of the Choice Act and its addendum.

WHO MAY ENROLL?

UCC has an open door policy and admits students in the following categories:

- Graduates from accredited secondary schools.
- Individuals who have earned the GED Certificate of Equivalency or an Adult High School Diploma.
- Non-high school graduates who are 18 years old or over and whose high school class has graduated.
- Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old who are not required to attend high school and who furnish a written Release from Compulsory School Attendance may make application as a special student (ORS 339.030).
- High school juniors or seniors who present written approval from their school officials. (Course load must be approved by both schools.)
- Some programs have special program requirements other than listed above.

Citizens of other countries must meet certain federal immigration and college requirements before admittance to Umpqua Community College. International students can request special application materials from the UCC website.

Adult Basic Skills. Required to attend an orientation.

Non-credit students are not required to submit a formal application.

EARLY REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT

Student who register early for a subsequent term(s) must pay the tuition and fees due.

Students with no schedule changes may mail or drop off a check (with their name and identification number) in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center by the dates listed for each term.

PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees for each term may be paid in one of the following ways:

1. Payment in full or online payment plan **by September 25.**
2. Approved Financial Aid.

Registration **AFTER September 25** must be accompanied by payment in full or online payment plan.

Failure to pay may result in being dropped from classes.

Any unpaid debts will be put into the collections process 30 days after the end of the quarter. Appeals may be submitted to the Finance Office.

OUTSTANDING FINES / DEBTS

Students who owe library fines or other monies to the college will not be allowed to register until all such debts have been cleared through the Finance/Accounts Office.

CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

The college reserves the right to cancel any class because of extenuating circumstances, such as low enrollment.

REFUNDS**Credit Tuition Refunds**

Students who withdraw from one or more UCC courses and who have complied with regulations governing withdrawals are entitled to certain refunds of tuition depending on the time of withdrawal. Refunds are limited to students who comply with withdrawal procedures.

Consequences for Not Paying

The college may take any or all of the following actions if students fail to pay their accounts:

- Require immediate payment in full
- Block enrollment for future terms
- Decline to provide official transcripts
- Assign accounts to collections for non-payment
- Assign the debt to the Oregon Department of Revenue to offset any refunds or sums due

FINANCIAL AID

Students must apply for financial aid every year by filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA may be submitted starting October 1 for the next academic year. Applying for financial aid can be time-consuming; a quick response to UCC requests for information can shorten the process. PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT

The placement assessment is required for all credit students. It is given on a walk-in basis in Testing Service in the Educational Skills Building. Call 541-440-4610 or come by for available days and times.

DROPS / WITHDRAWALS

Students registered for classes are considered to be in attendance. Students discontinuing attendance without filing the official drop/withdrawal form in the Registration Office may receive a failing grade. Recipients of Title IV financial aid are subject to the federal regulations for withdrawals from classes for a term.

Students wishing to drop/delete (which does not appear on the academic transcript) from a course(s) must initiate the withdrawal procedure within the first five instructional days of each term (except for classes less than 10 weeks in length). The appropriate form must be filed in the Enrollment Services Office. After five days, the following withdrawal (appears on the academic transcript as a "W") procedures must be followed.

WITHDRAWAL FROM UCC

To withdraw from all courses, students must get signatures from a counselor and the financial aid office. The withdrawal form must be completed and filed in the Enrollment Services Office.

WITHDRAWAL BY INSTRUCTOR

Students who register for a class but do not attend the first class, or who contact the instructor before the first class meeting of the term, may be withdrawn by the instructor.

STUDENT EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), also known as the Buckley Amendment, covers the release and inspection of student educational records. In compliance with FERPA, Umpqua Community College has formulated the Student Records Policy to outline the proper handling and release of these records. See the UCC catalog at www.umpqua.edu.

DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Umpqua Community College defines certain information as "directory information," which may be released to a third party upon written request. Students may sign a *Withhold Directory Information Request* to prevent the release of this information. Students who sign the request will not be listed in news releases concerning honor rolls or in commencement publications.

STUDENT HEALTH (ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS) INSURANCE

Umpqua Community College no longer offers student accident/sickness insurance. For more information, contact the Student Life Office at 541-440-7749.

STUDENT ID CARDS

All registered students are entitled to an ID card. The ID card serves as official UCC photo identification and can be used as a UCC library card. ID cards are available from the Information Desk in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center. Students must show a copy

of their current class schedule and another form of photo ID. Call 541-440-4600 for ID processing hours. ID cards must be validated each term. Validation stickers are available from the Information Desk in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center, from the Student Accounts in the the Student Center (located next to Financial Aid) and the Library.

PARKING

SMOKING

Smoking and tobacco use are not permitted inside the perimeter of any Umpqua Community College property. Designated smoking areas are provided near parking lots on the outside perimeter of campus. Marijuana is not permitted on campus.

BUS SERVICE

CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY

Campus security coverage is maintained seven days a week. Security staff may be contacted by calling 541-440-7777 or dialing 7777 from any campus extension. In addition to providing a safe working environment, Campus Security enforces traffic and parking regulations, promotes crime prevention and secures the college buildings and facilities. Campus crime information is collected annually and is available upon request.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Students at Umpqua Community College are expected to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with an educational environment and in accordance with standards of the college that perpetuate its educational purpose. Students can access

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

Students are to read and abide by the contents of the current UCC Catalog, which sets forth the terms and conditions of enrollment and supersedes and replaces any previous Catalog. Those changes will be posted on the UCC website and when appropriate, will be incorporated in future editions of the UCC Catalog.

SPOTLIGHT ON WELDING

OVEN MITTS FOR WELDING GLOVES

Devona Culver always wanted to be like her older brother—especially when it came to welding. When the time came for the Umpqua Community College (UCC) student to choose a career, she didn't hesitate in taking a non-traditional path.

"(My brother) always told me nothing is out of bounds," she said. "He always let me know that I could do and succeed at whatever I put my mind to."

When Devona's inspiration to become a welder came around, it wasn't just her brother who had an influence. There's a family legacy in molding metal and steel. Devona's mom, brother, and grandfather were all welders. Her grandfather actually had a hand in building the monorail in Las Vegas.

"I've been around people who work really hard all of my life," she said. "I saw welding as just another hard job that I'd like to take on."

Devona was used to taking heat on a job site. Before entering UCC's Welding program in 2015, she worked as a baker.

"I got used to getting hot and getting burned, so welding seemed right up my alley," she said. "All I did was trade my oven mitts for welding gloves."

According to Welding Program Coordinator Ian Fisher, there are 75 employers up and down the I-5 corridor who are hiring welders.

"UCC can't graduate welders fast enough to keep up with the demand," Fisher said.

Welders can take their skills all over the world, or stay close to home and work in their own backyard. Devona, who will officially earn her degree this coming fall, is hoping for the closer option. When she's ready, there will be a job for her, and she'll get to choose. She's in demand and ready to get the job done.

"I want to pull my own weight when I get hired," she said. "I'm definitely not afraid of hard work."

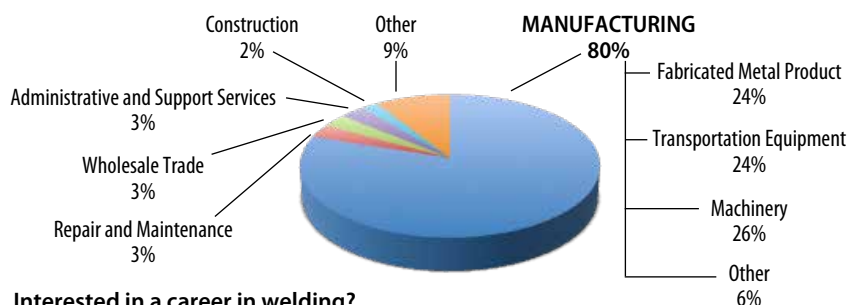


WELDING FAST FACTS

Welding graduates have many employment opportunities. According to the State of Oregon Employment Department, the statewide average annual salary for welders is \$38,535, and \$38,040 for positions in Coos, Curry, and Douglas County. Wages for welders in Douglas County vary from \$10 to \$25 an hour.

- Welding training typically takes six to nine months to complete
- 90% of those who complete training are placed in an entry-level job or move on for additional training

The majority of Oregon's welders work in manufacturing.

- 1. Prepare.** Fill out the FAFSA. Need help? Contact a Peer Mentor at (541) 440-7893.
 - Seek additional financial aid. Visit other UCC offices if seeking VA benefits, scholarships and work-study options.
- 2. Apply.** Complete the Admissions Application either online or in person. Visit the Admissions Office in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center. Receive immediate acceptance to the college!
 - If you have completed coursework outside of UCC, contact the institution to request an official copy be sent to: UCC Admissions Office, PO Box 967, Roseburg, OR 97470
- 3. Connect.** Activate your student account.
 - Complete the student orientation.
- 4. Enroll.** Complete the placement tests. Placement tests consist of three parts: math, reading and writing. Your test may take two hours and is FREE the first attempt. All newly-admitted students and/or returning transfer students who have not completed equivalent courses with a C or higher will need to take the placement test. Call (541) 440-4610 for an appointment or available walk-in times.
 - Meet with an Academic Advisor. Students must meet with their advisor to discuss placement test results, chosen program and/or first term classes in order to register for courses.
 - Register for courses either online or in person. Call (541) 440-4610 to schedule an appointment.
 - Pay for courses. Payment is always due the first day of the term. You can pay with out-of-pocket resources (cash, card or check), or other funding (grants, financial aid), or by using our payment plan through Nelnet. 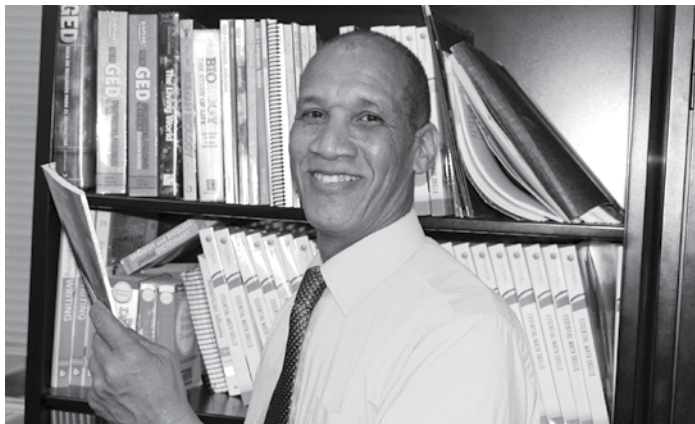
