

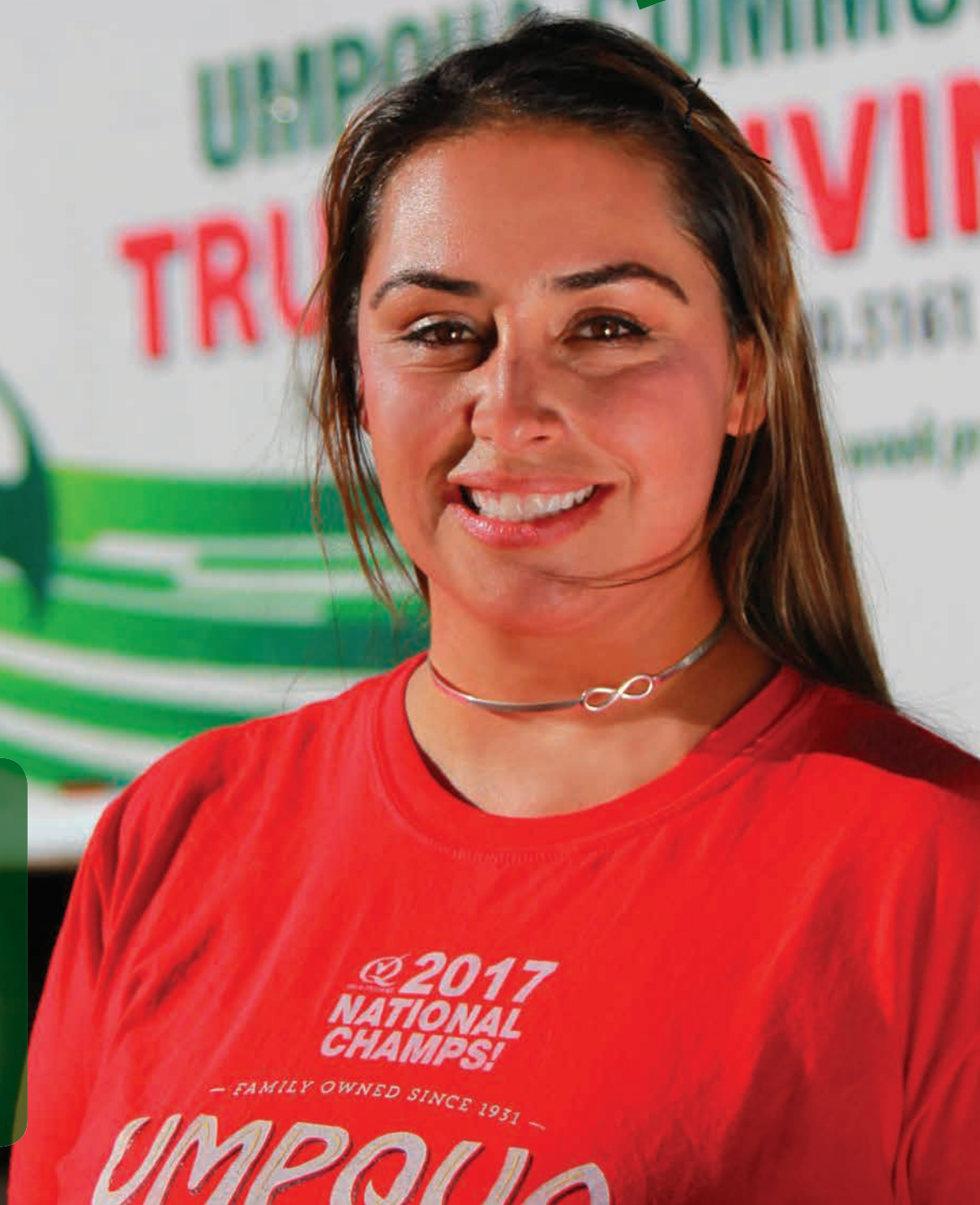

## How to get to UCC

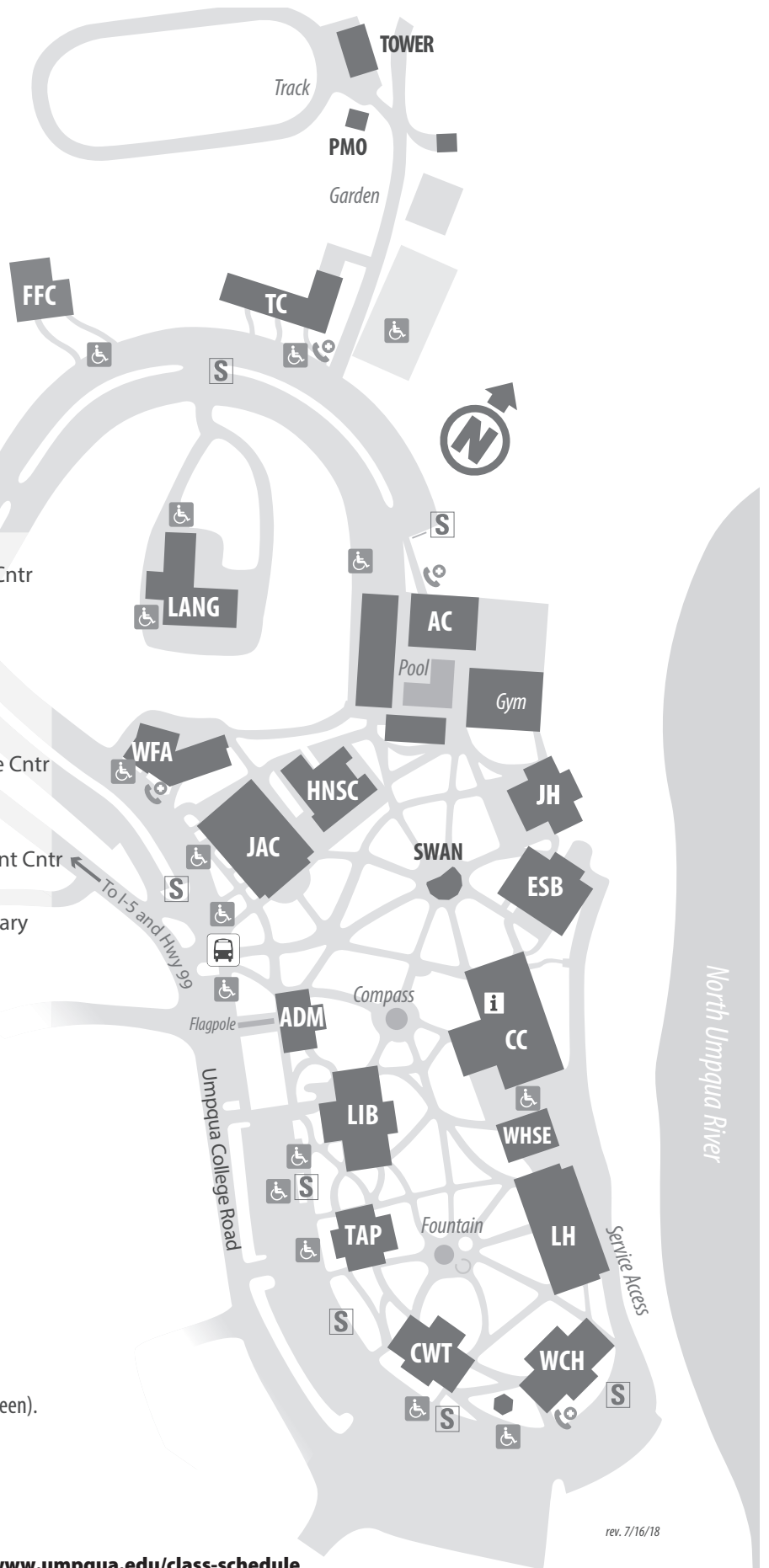

**STUDENT FEES**

At UCC a student may be required to pay for fees in addition to tuition. Credit classes require some “per credit” fees; term fees are charged each term; and course fees are associated with a specific class.

**STUDENT RESOURCES FEES**

**Student Activity Fee**

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee helps fund the operations of the Student Life office and supports student activities (including athletics). The fee funds the college contract with Umpqua Transit, which provides credit students with a reduced priced bus pass for the term.

**Student Fee for SUCCESS Program**

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the Success Center and Peer Mentor program.

**Technology Fee**

Provides for the upkeep and renewal of campus technology infrastructure in support of classrooms, computer labs, and campus information systems.

**Legacy Fee**

The fee will be used to fund new construction on campus and deferred maintenance on existing buildings.

**Credit Registration Fee**

This fee is charged each term to students who enroll in undergraduate credit classes. The proceeds go toward placement testing, degree/certificate application process, academic transcripts, degree verifications, and other record keeping.

**Student Insurance Fee**

This fee covers the premium for accident insurance while students are involved in college classes and activities, or traveling on college business. For more information, contact the Student Life Office at 541-440-7749.

**UCC Online & Hybrid Class Fees**

Fees pay for costs associated with providing students with online courses, including the delivery platform.

**Course Fees**

Course fees pay for the materials & supplies associated with the class you are taking (ie: lab supplies for a Science class or liability insurance for Nursing). Some courses are offered as self support and carry a fee amount that is required for course delivery and materials.

**Instructional Fees**

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the costs associated with labs and lecture/lab class formats.

**WHO MAY ENROLL?**

UCC has an open door policy and admits students in the following categories:

- Graduates from accredited secondary schools.
- Individuals who have earned the GED Certificate of Equivalency or an Adult High School Diploma.
- Non-high school graduates who are 18 years old or over and whose high school class has graduated.
- Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old who are not required to attend high school and who furnish a written Release from Compulsory School Attendance may make application as a special student (ORS 339.030).
- High school juniors or seniors who present written approval from their school officials. (Course load must be approved by both schools.)
- Some programs have special program requirements other than listed above.

Citizens of other countries must meet certain federal immigration and college requirements before admittance to Umpqua Community College. International students can request special application materials from the UCC website.

Adult Basic Skills. Students are required to attend an orientation.

Non-credit students are not required to submit a formal application.

**EARLY REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT**

Students who register early for a subsequent term(s) must pay the tuition and fees due.

Students with no schedule changes may mail or drop off a check (with their name and identification number) in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center by the dates listed for each term.

**PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES**

Tuition and fees for each term may be paid in one of the following ways:

1. Payment in full or online payment plan by **September 24**.
2. Approved Financial Aid.

Registration **AFTER September 24** must be accompanied by payment in full or online payment plan.

Failure to pay may result in being dropped from classes.

Any unpaid debts will be put into the collections process 30 days after the end of the quarter. Appeals may be submitted to the Finance Office.

**OUTSTANDING FINES / DEBTS**

Students who owe library fines or other monies to the college will not be allowed to register until all such debts have been cleared through Accounting & Finance - Student Accounts Department, located in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center.

**CANCELLATION OF CLASSES**

The college reserves the right to cancel any class because of extenuating circumstances, such as low enrollment.

**REFUNDS****Credit Tuition Refunds**

Students who withdraw from one or more UCC courses and who have complied with regulations governing withdrawals are entitled to certain refunds of tuition depending on the time of withdrawal. Refunds are limited to students who comply with withdrawal procedures.

**Consequences for Not Paying**

The college may take any or all of the following actions if students fail to pay their accounts:

- Require immediate payment in full
- Block enrollment for future terms
- Decline to provide official transcripts
- Assign accounts to collections for non-payment
- Assign the debt to the Oregon Department of Revenue to offset any refunds or sums due

**FINANCIAL AID**

**PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT**

The placement assessment is required for all credit students. Walk-in placement testing for Fall, Winter and Spring terms are on Tuesdays from 8:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m., and Thursdays from 10:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. in the Educational Skills Building 29. For appointments, call 541-440-7659 for available days and times.

**DROPS / WITHDRAWALS**

Students registered for classes are considered to be in attendance. Students discontinuing attendance without filing the official drop/withdrawal form in the Registration Office may receive a failing grade. Recipients of Title IV financial aid are subject to the federal regulations for withdrawals from classes for a term.

Students wishing to drop/delete (which does not appear on the academic transcript)

from a course(s) must initiate the withdrawal procedure within the first five instructional days of each term (except for classes less than 10 weeks in length). The appropriate form must be filed in the Registration and Records Office. After five days, the following withdrawal (appears on the academic transcript as a "W") procedures must be followed.

**WITHDRAWAL FROM UCC**

To withdraw from all courses, students must get signatures from a counselor and the financial aid office. The withdrawal form must be completed and filed in the Registration and Records Office.

**WITHDRAWAL BY INSTRUCTOR**

Students who register for a class but do not attend the first class, or who contact the instructor before the first class meeting of the term, may be withdrawn by the instructor.

**STUDENT EDUCATIONAL RECORDS**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), also known as the Buckley Amendment, covers the release and inspection of student educational records. In compliance with FERPA, Umpqua Community College has formulated the Student Records Policy to outline the proper handling and release of these records. **DIRECTORY INFORMATION**

Umpqua Community College defines certain information as "directory information," which may be released to a third party upon written request. Students may sign a *Withhold Directory Information Request* to prevent the release of this information. Students who sign the request will not be listed in news releases concerning honor rolls or in commencement publications.

**STUDENT INSURANCE**

Umpqua Community College no longer offers student accident/sickness insurance. For more information, contact the Student Life Office at 541-440-7749.

**STUDENT ID CARDS**

All registered students are entitled to an ID card that serves as official UCC photo identification. The ID card station is located in the Student Center and is open from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Mon-Fri (Fall, Winter, Spring); 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Mon-Thur (Summer).

Students must show a copy of their current class schedule and other form of photo ID. ID cards must be validated each term. Validation stickers are available at the Information Desk or Student Accounts in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center and at the Reference Desk in the Sue Shaffer Learning Commons & Library.

**PARKING**

Umpqua Community College provides ample parking spaces near and around all campus buildings. Stickers and placards required

**SMOKING**

Smoking and tobacco use are not permitted inside the perimeter of any Umpqua Community College property. Designated smoking areas are provided near parking lots on the outside perimeter of campus. Marijuana is not permitted on campus.

**BUS SERVICE**

**CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY**

Campus security coverage is maintained seven days a week. Security staff may be contacted by calling 541-440-7777 or dialing 7777 from any campus extension. In addition to providing a safe working environment, Campus Security enforces traffic and parking regulations, promotes crime prevention and secures the college buildings and facilities. Campus crime information is collected annually and is available upon request.

**STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT**

Students at Umpqua Community College are expected to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with an educational environment and in accordance with standards of the college that perpetuate its educational purpose. **GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE**

A grievance procedure and binding arbitration is provided for any dispute or claim (including those based upon a statute, tort, or public policy) that a student has with the College regarding the terms and conditions of enrollment by the College.

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

Students are to read and abide by the contents of the current UCC Catalog, which sets forth the terms and conditions of enrollment and supersedes and replaces any previous Catalog. Circumstances will undoubtedly require that the policies, procedures, rules, and benefits described in this Catalog change from time to time as the College deems necessary or appropriate, and those changes will be valid

when approved by UCC administration and/or voted by the Board of Trustees. Those changes will be posted on the UCC website and when appropriate, will be incorporated in future editions of the UCC Catalog.

## NO COST TEXTBOOKS / 50 DOLLARS OR UNDER TEXTBOOKS

Classes with **No Cost Textbooks** and **50 Dollars or Under Textbooks** are identified in the Student Self-Service when registering for classes. Students can use the **Advanced Search** to find classes which have either a **No Cost Textbook** or a **50 Dollars or Under Textbook**.

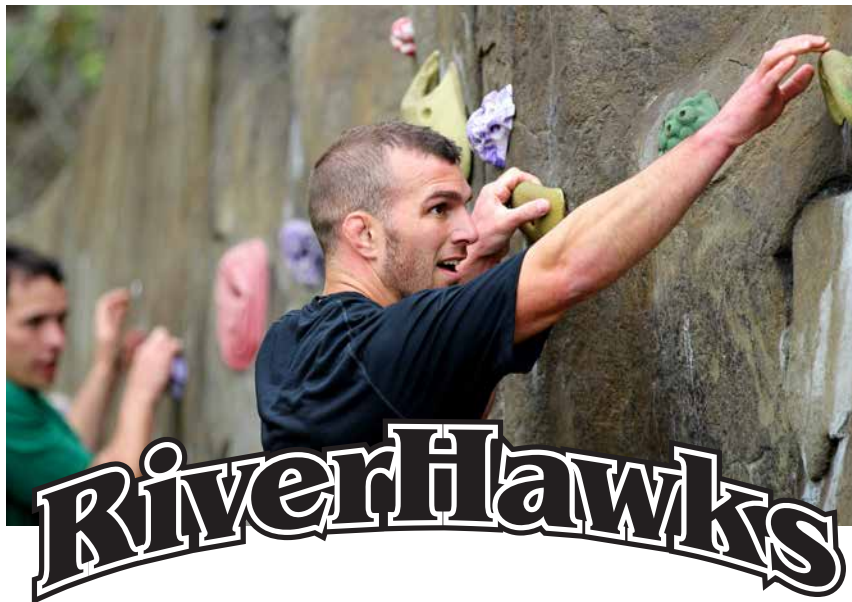

# SPOTLIGHT ON STUDENT SUCCESS

## BLAZING A TRAIL FROM BEHIND A BIG WHEEL

When Jessica Luttrell moved to Douglas County five years ago, it was a struggle just to put food on the table. While she did everything from tutoring to working at a local fast food restaurant, her husband—an electrician by trade—would stand on a street corner with a sign that stated “Looking for work.” Paying bills was a challenge.

“At the time, I remember thinking how terrible things were,” Jessica said.

Being new to the area, Jessica was exposed to new, eye-catching things. She couldn’t help but notice how many log trucks and chip trucks were on the roads. Big trucks were everywhere she looked. She told herself she needed to learn how to drive one of these trucks in order to get ahead.

“Everyone I talked to about (becoming a truck driver) told me I was a girly-girl,” she said. “They told me I should become a receptionist or something, but my husband, Jerry, encouraged me to do what I wanted.”

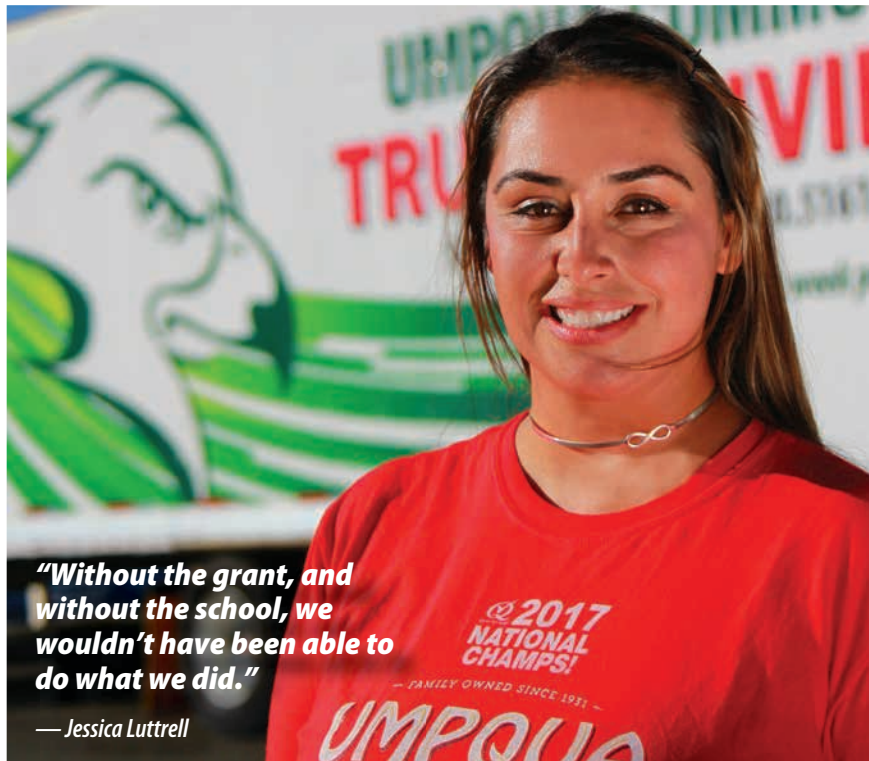
Jessica and her family live in Days Creek. While driving on the interstate one day, she made a life-changing discovery. She saw the Umpqua Community College (UCC) Truck Driving School near the Round Prairie Road exit, and decided to stop at the yard.

“The guys I met there that day were really nice and helpful,” she said. “They told me to work on getting my permit, so that’s exactly what I did.”

With her commercial learner’s permit in hand, Jessica started school in 2014. She was able to participate in the training thanks to a grant through Umpqua Training and Employment. Part of the program’s requirements included interviewing three truck drivers. To accomplish the goal, she spent her time walking around truck stops asking drivers questions.

“To qualify for the grant, they wanted to make sure I knew what I was getting into, so I had to do some research,” she said.

Four weeks after starting school, Jessica completed the program and was ready to hit the road. She was hired by a trucking company based in California. During her first three months on the job, her husband decided he would go through UCC’s Truck Driving program as well. After he completed the program, they became team drivers for

the same company. For the first time in their lives, they no longer qualified for any kind of assistance.

“We are so grateful,” Jerry said. “We now have careers, benefits, retirement accounts, health care, everything. And, we’re on track to make six figures this year.”

“Without the grant, and without the school, we wouldn’t have been able to do what we did,” Jessica said. “It has totally changed our lives.”

The Luttrell’s no longer team drive, and each works for a different company. Jerry is a regional driver who is home every weekend. And last September, Jessica became the first woman truck driver at Umpqua Dairy.

“Before I started UCC’s Truck Driving program, I didn’t even know how to jump (start) my own car,” she said. “And now, I can drive anything from a flatbed to a tanker.”

UCC’s Truck Driving program is offered through Community and Workforce Training. Upon program completion, UCC provides graduates with job placement assistance.

### Truck Driving in Oregon\*

- ▶ The number one most difficult-to-fill occupation in the State of Oregon is currently heavy and tractor-trailer truck driver.
- ▶ In 2017, there were 1,799 truck driver vacancies in the state; 1,538 of these vacancies are difficult-to-fill.
- ▶ Businesses that reported the highest number of these vacancies (74%) were located in Southwestern Oregon.

### Truck Driving in the U.S.\*\*

- ▶ 70% of the goods consumed in the U.S. are moved by truck.
- ▶ There is currently a driver shortage.
- ▶ An aging fleet of drivers is one of the main reasons for the shortage.
- ▶ The average age of a commercial truck driver in the U.S. is 49 years old; only 6% are women.
- ▶ To meet the industry’s rising demand, the American Trucking Association estimates that 90,000 new drivers will be hired each year for the next decade.
- ▶ According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the median annual pay in 2017 was \$42,480.

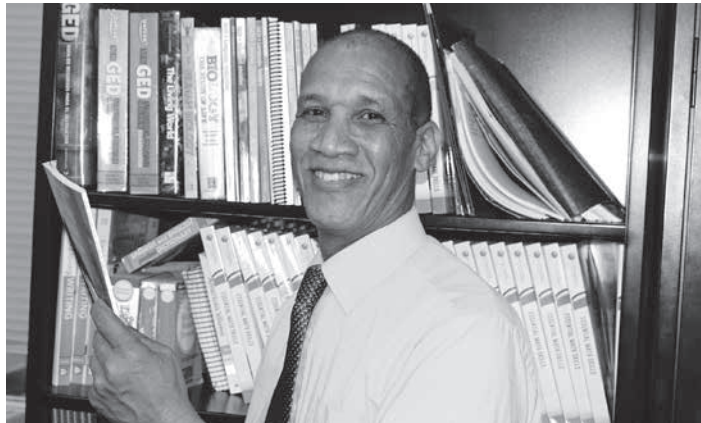

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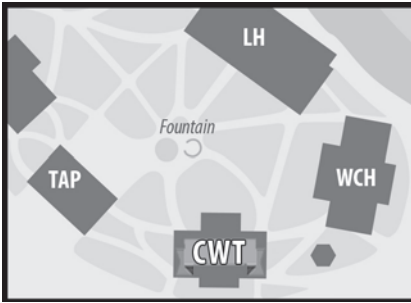
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## Science renamed Community and Workforce Training

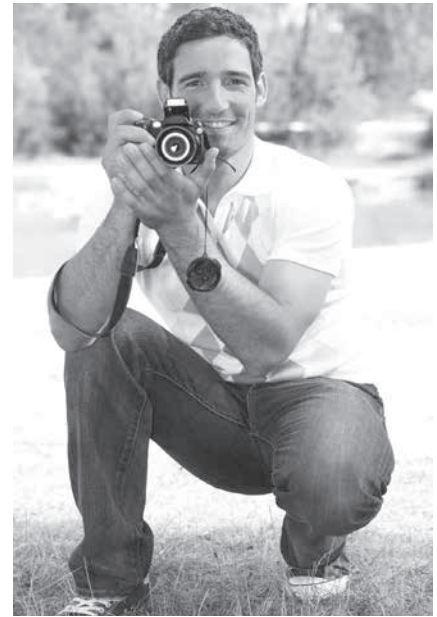

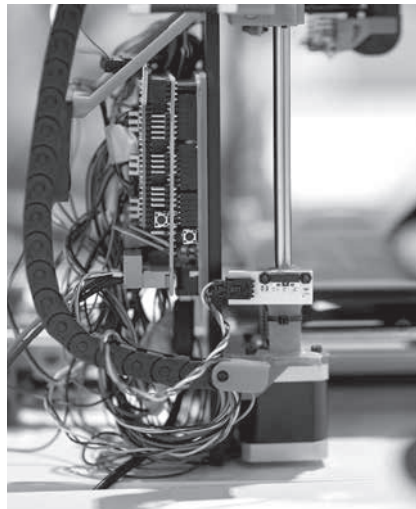
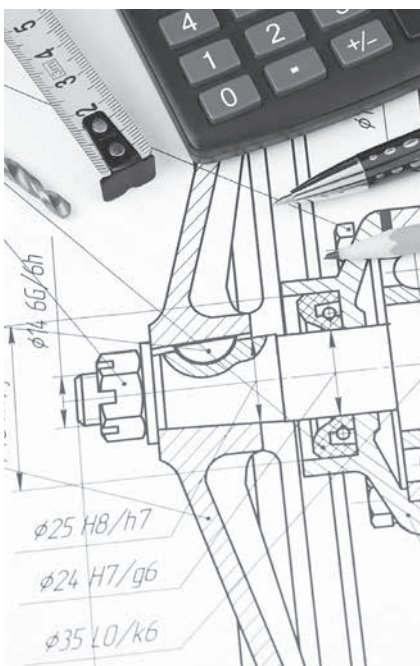

# A NEW PLACE TO LEARN AND GROW

On Tuesday, May 15, UCC officially welcomed the campus' newest vineyard. Named in honor of Charlie Williams, a long-time wine industry and Southern Oregon Wine Institute (SOWI) supporter, the three-acre memorial vineyard will be a new teaching lab for Viticulture and Enology Program students starting this Fall.

Charlie's Place has been a few years in the making. The UCC Board of Education approved its establishment in March 2017. Students over the past two academic years have been involved in bringing the vineyard to life. They helped plan the trellis, layout, and varieties. They also helped install the vineyard.

"This vineyard could not have been done without a lot community effort," Andy Swan, the director of SOWI, said. "Along with the students, several industry partners went above

and beyond to ensure Charlie was honored, and that students were given a living legacy."

Over the past year, the foundation was laid to make the hill on the campus' west side plant worthy. Irrigation was installed, fencing was erected, and rows to support new vines were established. Once the work was completed, Charlie's wife, Dorothy, traveled from California to place the vineyard's first plant in the ground during a groundbreaking ceremony.

"Charlie sure loved to dig in the dirt," Dorothy said. "We arrived in the Umpqua Valley before it was a wine region, and we knew early on that Oregon was a prime spot. This would have made him very proud."

Charlie worked for big names in the California wine industry; Robert Mondavi and Opus One Wineries. When he retired, the Williams' bought

land in the Umpqua Valley and began growing strong, insect-resistant root stock. They sold it nurseries, ensuring that a legacy of healthy vineyards would continue in Oregon.

UCC's new vineyard is the recipient of some of that strong root stock. The three new varietal vines are grafted onto it. Viognier will be planted on the vineyard's upper block. Syrah and Tempranillo will be planted on the lower block. The new additions will round out the Sauvignon Blanc and Pinot Noir grapes already being grown at the campus.

"Having vineyards on site gives students real-world experience in all aspects of Viticulture and Enology," Swan said. "From inception in the classroom and vineyard to wine sales in the tasting room, the more hands-on experience we can provide to students, the better their job prospects will be. Charlie's Place will definitely help further student success."
