How to get to UCC

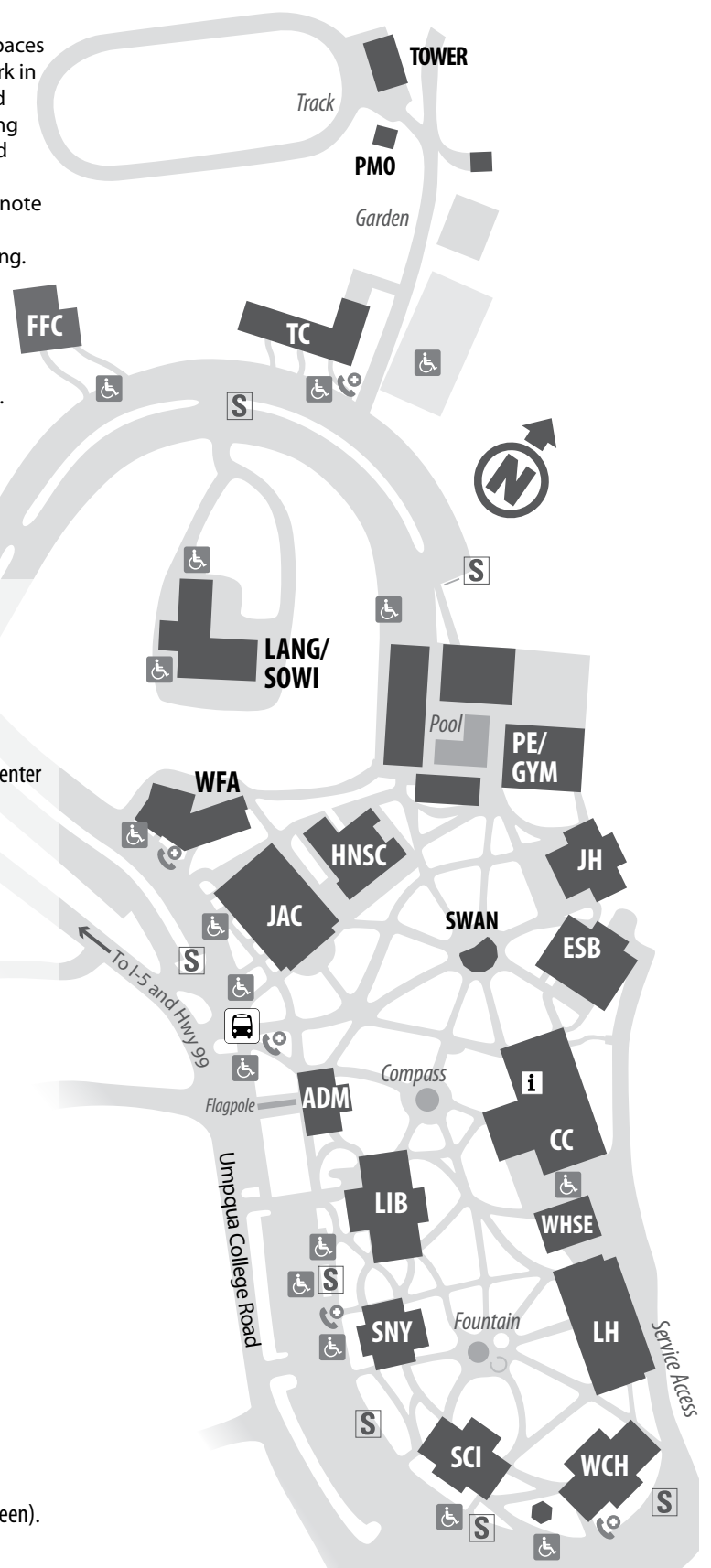

All veterans and their eligible dependents pay in-state tuition rates in compliance with Section 702 of the Choice Act and its addendum.

WHO MAY ENROLL?

UCC has an open door policy and admits students in the following categories:

- Graduates from accredited secondary schools.
- Individuals who have earned the GED Certificate of Equivalency or an Adult High School Diploma.
- Non-high school graduates who are 18 years old or over and whose high school class has graduated.
- Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old who are not required to attend high school and who furnish a written Release from Compulsory School Attendance may make application as a special student (ORS 339.030).
- High school juniors or seniors who present written approval from their school officials. (Course load must be approved by both schools.)
- Some programs have special program requirements other than listed above.

Citizens of other countries must meet certain federal immigration and college requirements before admittance to Umpqua Community College. International students can request special application materials from the UCC website.

Adult Basic Skills. Students are required to attend an orientation.

Non-credit students are not required to submit a formal application.

EARLY REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT

Students who register early for a subsequent term(s) must pay the tuition and fees due.

Students with no schedule changes may mail or drop off a check (with their name and identification number) in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center by the dates listed for each term.

PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees for each term may be paid in one of the following ways:

1. Payment in full or online payment plan **by April 2.**
2. Approved Financial Aid.

Registration **AFTER April 2** must be accompanied by payment in full or online payment plan.

Failure to pay may result in being dropped from classes.

Any unpaid debts will be put into the collections process 30 days after the end of the quarter. Appeals may be submitted to the Finance Office.

OUTSTANDING FINES / DEBTS

Students who owe library fines or other monies to the college will not be allowed to register until all such debts have been cleared through the Finance/Student Accounts Office.

CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

The college reserves the right to cancel any class because of extenuating circumstances, such as low enrollment.

REFUNDS**Credit Tuition Refunds**

Students who withdraw from one or more UCC courses and who have complied with regulations governing withdrawals are entitled to certain refunds of tuition depending on the time of withdrawal. Refunds are limited to students who comply with withdrawal procedures.

Consequences for Not Paying

The college may take any or all of the following actions if students fail to pay their accounts:

- Require immediate payment in full
- Block enrollment for future terms
- Decline to provide official transcripts
- Assign accounts to collections for non-payment
- Assign the debt to the Oregon Department of Revenue to offset any refunds or sums due

FINANCIAL AID

Students must apply for financial aid every year by filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA may be submitted starting October 1 for the next academic year. Applying for financial aid can be time-consuming; a quick response to UCC requests for information can shorten the process. Notification of financial aid awards are e-mailed to student e-mail addresses.

PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT

The placement assessment is required for all credit students. Walk-in placement testing for Fall, Winter and Spring terms are on Tuesdays from 8:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m., and Thursdays from 10:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. in the Educational Skills Building. For appointments, call 541-440-7659 for available days and times.

DROPS / WITHDRAWALS

Students registered for classes are considered to be in attendance. Students discontinuing attendance without filing the official drop/withdrawal form in the Registration Office may receive a failing grade. Recipients of Title IV financial aid are subject to the federal regulations for withdrawals from classes for a term.

Students wishing to drop/delete (which does not appear on the academic transcript) from a course(s) must initiate the withdrawal procedure within the first five instructional days of each term (except for classes less than 10 weeks in length). The appropriate form must be filed in the Enrollment Services Office. After five days, the following withdrawal (appears on the academic transcript as a "W") procedures must be followed.

WITHDRAWAL FROM UCC

To withdraw from all courses, students must get signatures from a counselor and the financial aid office. The withdrawal form must be completed and filed in the Enrollment Services Office.

WITHDRAWAL BY INSTRUCTOR

Students who register for a class but do not attend the first class, or who contact the instructor before the first class meeting of the term, may be withdrawn by the instructor.

STUDENT EDUCATIONAL RECORDS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), also known as the Buckley Amendment, covers the release and inspection of student educational records. In compliance with FERPA, Umpqua Community College has formulated the Student Records Policy to outline the proper handling and release of these records. See the UCC catalog at www.umpqua.edu.

DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Umpqua Community College defines certain information as "directory information," which may be released to a third party upon written request. Students may sign a *Withhold Directory Information Request* to prevent the release of this information. Students who sign the request will not be listed in news releases concerning honor rolls or in commencement publications.

STUDENT HEALTH (ACCIDENT AND SICKNESS) INSURANCE

STUDENT ID CARDS

All registered students are entitled to an ID card that serves as official UCC photo identification. The ID card station is located in the Student Center and is open from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Mon-Fri (Fall, Winter, Spring); please call 541-440-4600 for Summer term hours.

Students must show a copy of their current class schedule and other form of photo ID. ID cards must be validated each term. Validation stickers are available at the Information Desk or Student Accounts in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center and at the Reference Desk in the Sue Shaffer Learning Commons & Library.

PARKING

SMOKING

CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY

Campus security coverage is maintained seven days a week. Security staff may be contacted by calling 541-440-7777 or dialing 7777 from any campus extension. In addition to providing a safe working environment, Campus Security enforces traffic and parking regulations, promotes crime prevention and secures the college buildings and facilities. Campus crime information is collected annually and is available upon request.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

Students at Umpqua Community College are expected to conduct themselves in a manner compatible with an educational environment and in accordance with standards of the college that perpetuate its educational purpose. GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

A grievance procedure and binding arbitration is provided for any dispute or claim (including those based upon a statute, tort, or public policy) that a student has with the College regarding the terms and conditions of enrollment by the College.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Students are to read and abide by the contents of the current UCC Catalog, which sets forth the terms and conditions of enrollment and supersedes and replaces any previous Catalog. Circumstances will undoubtedly require that the policies, procedures, rules, and benefits described in this Catalog change from time to time as the College deems necessary or appropriate, and those changes will be valid when approved by UCC administration and/or voted by the Board of Trustees. Those changes will be posted on the UCC website and when appropriate, will be incorporated in future editions of the UCC Catalog.



SPOTLIGHT ON STUDENT SUCCESS

CREATING THE ROAD TO SUCCESS

If there is anyone who understands how to create a road to success, it is definitely Heather Neavoll. From her desk at the Oregon Department of Transportation in Roseburg, road creation is her business. The Umpqua Community College (UCC) graduate spends her days working as a senior drafter. It's a far distance from where she started in high school doing roadside litter patrol.

"I always liked being outdoors and active," she said. "So I just kind of picked something and went with it. I started taking Engineering classes in high school as a dual-credit student. I also spent many, many summers on the highway."

Heather graduated from Roseburg High School in 2010. She became a first-generation college student when she started at UCC. Each school year she spent as a student, she spent every summer out on the road. She worked in construction during college, and also had the opportunity to go out on projects as an inspector. She ultimately chose UCC because she considers herself to be very frugal.

"I decided to invest in a two-year school as opposed to a four-year school because I didn't want to spend a lot of money on something if I didn't know if I wanted to do it," she said.

Heather was hired at ODOT in 2015. She has done surveying, inspecting, and now drafting in her position. School backed up her in-the-field experience,



and she enjoyed the hands-on learning opportunities she received.

"It's a tough task at first," she said. "But if you stick with it, it can be very rewarding."

Her advice to students: Ask questions, get help when you need it, and push through.

"Choosing to go to school has made a huge difference in my life," she said. "If I hadn't gone to school, my living situation would be totally different. I've been able to buy a house and be somewhat financially secure."

During her time at UCC, Heather also left a permanent mark on the College's history. She had a hand in helping to build the Bonnie J. Ford Health, Nursing and Science Center. She did drafting on the project, and also had the opportunity to mentor people coming in as temporary construction workers.

"It was such a blessing to be able to go to UCC," she said. "Not only did I leave there without debt, I've been able to use my education to work my way through the stepping stones."

NEW TO UCC

IF YOU ARE NEW TO UCC, WE RECOMMEND THE FOLLOWING STEPS TO GET YOU OFF TO A SUCCESSFUL START:

- 1. Prepare.** Fill out the FAFSA. Need help? Contact a Peer Mentor at (541) 440-7893.
 - Seek additional financial aid. Visit other UCC offices if seeking VA benefits, scholarships and work-study options.
- 2. Apply.** Complete the Admissions Application either online or in person. Visit the Admissions Office in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center. Receive immediate acceptance to the college!
 - If you have completed coursework outside of UCC, contact the institution to request an official transcript copy be sent to: UCC Admissions Office, PO Box 967, Roseburg, OR 97470
- 3. Connect.** Activate your student account.
 - Complete the student orientation.
- 4. Enroll.** Complete the placement tests. Placement tests consist of three parts: math, reading and writing. Your test may take two hours and is FREE the first attempt. All newly-admitted students and/or returning transfer students who have not completed equivalent courses with a C or higher will need to take the placement test. Call (541) 440-7659 for an appointment or available walk-in times.
 - Meet with an Academic Advisor to discuss placement test results, chosen program and/or first term classes in order to register for courses. Meetings are by appointment only. Log on to Student Self-Service account. Choose **Make Advisor Appointments Here**.

 - Pay for courses. Payment is always due the first day of the term. 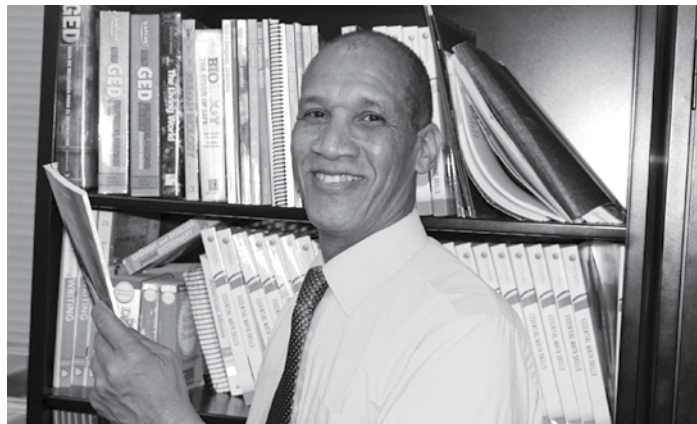

ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACQUISITION (ELA)

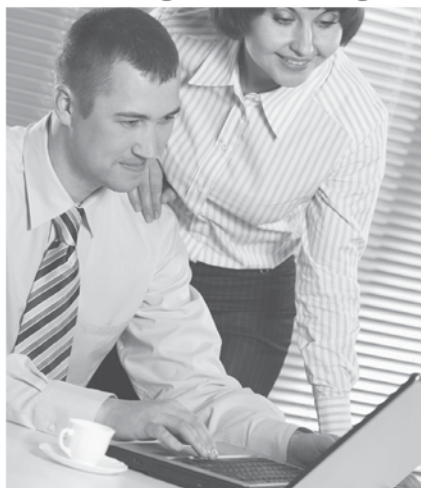

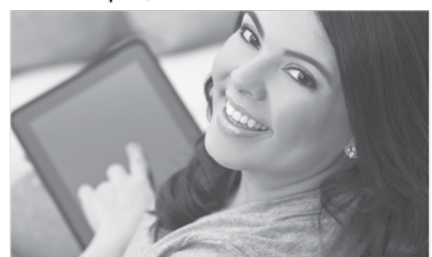
