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SPOTLIGHT ON STUDENT SUCCESS

Building Better Futures One Student at a Time

Earlier this year, the federal government announced a controversial decision to transfer the Job Corps Civilian Conservation Center program from the U.S. Department of Forest Services to the U.S. Department of Labor. The transfer meant 9 of the country's 25 centers would permanently close. One of the centers to remain open directly impacts Umpqua Community College. Following a national outcry from representatives and the citizens they serve, the government reversed its decision in June. It meant the Wolf Creek Job Corps (WCJC) is here to stay.

Job Corps is a no-cost education and career technical training program that helps people between the ages of 16 and 24 improve their quality of life through education. Locally, operations at the Wolf Creek site have been The facility, which is located in rural Glide, is like a mini city. It has residence halls, a cafeteria, store, wellness center, gym, library, community garden, and more. Practically the only things you won't find here are cell phone and internet service.

Training at the Center includes welding, carpentry, cement masonry, construction craft labor, office administration, culinary arts, forestry conservation, and firefighting. Off-Center training includes maintenance and light repair, and certified nurse assistant.

"Workforce development is our number one mission," Center Director Gabe Wishart said. "Our goal is to turn disadvantaged youths into taxpayers. I tell students this is their once-in-alifetime opportunity to receive this kind of support."

fulfilled through a contract between the federal government and UCC for more than 50 years. Housing, food, basic toiletries, and on-the-job training are provided to students for free. Its capacity is 230 students. For students like Krista Cornelius and Daniel Belcher, the Center is a life line. Both Douglas County residents would face homelessness and live life with no direction without the Center. Today, they are learning and earning their way. "It seemed like a good program and I didn't have anything else going on when I decided to come here," Krista said. "I wanted to go to college after I graduated, but I didn't have the money to do it. That's one reason I'm here."

Krista turned to Job Corps when her home life changed. Faced with the prospect of no place to live, the Oakland High School graduate took a leap of faith. She moved to the Wolf Creek facility and started to learn her new trade.

"I knew I'd be able to get jobs by studying business," she said.

Now more than a year into her studies, Krista spends half her day working in the facility's administration building. She spends the other half in class. She has learned basic computing, online safety, typing and general office skills, business English, proper phone etiquette, and how to clerically support the Center's trades. With eight months left in the program, self-sufficiency is her next goal.

"I have learned so much here and I've gained many skills and new friends," she said. "The training I have received has made me feel more confident about my future."

Although Daniel Belcher did have a plan after he graduated from South Umpqua High School in 2012, he has traveled a similar path. Also facing homelessness outside of Job Corps, Daniel's goal was to become the 8th generation of his family to join the military. He planned to join the U.S. Navy and become a Seabee. He lost hope after battling with his weight.

"When it came time to enlist, I had a 48inch waist," he said. "The maximum size is 39 inches."

SPOTLIGHT ON COMMUNITY SUCCESS

In a Sweet Spot, Thanks to a Local Resource

Cody and Mandi Dolan purchased an existing business, known as Umpqua Sweets & Treats, in 2016. The business had been operating since 2008 and was located on NE Stephens Street in Roseburg when they took over. Umpqua Sweets & Treats is a sweet shop, focusing on artisan truffles, fudge, chocolates, ice cream, and gift baskets. The Dolans produce local, handmade, artisan treats to serve Roseburg and the surrounding community. They have also expanded the business model into commercial accounts.

After operating the shop on NE Stephens for two years, the Dolans were ready for the next chapter in a new location. They decided to move to the heart of Roseburg's downtown historic district. The space they found has more usable area and a new commercial kitchen. The new location offers a warm and inviting feeling when you walk through the door.

"We're very excited to transition into our new location downtown," Mandi said. "It's our opportunity to give the shop our own look and feel while also embracing the downtown Roseburg community and growing within the community as a whole."

The Dolans took on a large renovation project which had many challenges. In the end, it was well worth the difficulties when working with all the requirements needed to open their doors.

Changing locations is very risky in a retail established business, but they did it. Helping them to maintain cash flow during the renovations was their expansion into commercial accounts.

Everyone was very excited with the storefront once they re-opened. While

they'll continue their staple chocolates, they've added ice cream to the menu and plan to expand their treat offerings as they settle in. They hope the store becomes a destination for locals and visitors alike to stop in for delicious treats.

DISCOVERING UCC'S SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Mandi and Cody did not get to where they are overnight. They discovered UCC's Small Business Development Center (SBDC), which helped them find the resources they needed for success.

"Utilizing the SBDC for our business, even before our move, has been very beneficial," Mandi said. "The staff and advisers provide us with invaluable information. When we have a question, we can contact the SBDC and they will help us, or they would be able to direct us to someone who would have the answers. We utilized the SBDC for networking info, online presence guestions, and other miscellaneous guestions small business owners have. We have learned about social media and how to focus our ads to local audiences. make more engaging Facebook posts, and make our stores' Facebook page something people want to look at."

The Dolans are still building their website, but say the SBDC has helped guide them through that process as well. During the new shop's construction, the Dolans also received advice on how to navigate

> the permit process and who to speak to at the city and county governments regarding the buildout and how to install exterior signage.

The wealth of knowledge the team provides and their patience in explaining details has helped our business beyond measure. It's a great local resource that helped us immensely when we first moved here and took over the business. GENERAL INFORMATION

TUITION AND FEES

STUDENT FEES

At UCC a student may be required to pay for fees in addition to tuition. Credit classes require some "per credit" fees; term fees are charged each term; and course fees are associated with a specific class.

COURSE FEES

Course fees pay for the materials and supplies associated with the class you are taking (ie: lab supplies for a Science class or liability insurance for Nursing). Some courses are offered as self support and carry a fee amount that is required for course delivery and materials.

CREDIT REGISTRATION FEE

This fee is charged each term to students who enroll in undergraduate credit classes. The proceeds go toward placement testing, degree/certificate application process, academic transcripts, degree verifications, and other record keeping.

INSTRUCTIONAL FEES

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the costs associated with labs and lecture/lab class formats.

LEGACY FEE

The fee will be used to fund new construction on campus and deferred maintenance on existing buildings.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee helps fund the operations of the Student Life office and supports student activities (including athletics). The fee funds the college contract with Umpqua Transit, which provides credit students with a reduced priced bus pass for the term.

STUDENT FEE FOR SUCCESS PROGRAM

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the Success Center and Peer Mentor program.

STUDENT INSURANCE FEE

This fee covers the premium for accident insurance while students are involved in college classes and activities, or traveling on college business. For more information, contact the Student Life Office at 541-440-7749.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

Provides for the upkeep and renewal of campus technology infrastructure in support of classrooms, computer labs, and campus information systems.

UCC ONLINE & HYBRID CLASS FEES

Fees pay for costs associated with providing students with online courses, including the delivery platform.

Tuition and fees are payable by the deadline listed for each term. Tuition and fee rates are subject to change without prior notice.

RESOURCES FOR SUCCESS

ACADEMIC ADVISING

Academic advising is available in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center. A variety of student services are provided to meet a student's individual needs while attending UCC. Services provided by an Academic Advisor may include:

- Assistance with class scheduling, registration adding or dropping classes and appeals
- Developing a Student Educational Plan
- Connecting students with UCC support services and community resources
- Assistance with accessing community resources
- Providing support when students are facing challenges

ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

Students who experience barriers to access will find UCC's campus to be accessible and accommodating. BOOKSTORE

The UCC Bookstore is a resource for textbooks and course materials, school supplies, clothing, gifts, food items, beverages, laptops and a variety of items at affordable prices. Located adjacent to the LaVerne Murphy Student Center, store hours are from Mon-Fri, 7:30 am to 4 pm throughout most of the year. The store offers extended hours during rush week each term.

Students should bring a printed copy of their class schedules to ensure the correct textbooks

are purchased for classes. Textbook buybacks are scheduled during finals week for Fall, Winter and Spring Terms and the last two weeks of the Summer Term in August.

FINANCIAL AID

Located in the Laverne Murphy Student Center, the Financial Aid Office serves as a resource for students wishing to further their educational goals. Students interested in financial aid are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.gov. UCC's federal school code is 003222. Applications must be submitted each year beginning October 1. Possible resources include Federal and State grants, Federal Work Study and Federal Loans.

LIBRARY AND SUCCESS CENTER

The Library and Success Center, both located in the Sue Schaeffer Learning Commons, collaborate to provide a welcoming environment where students can access academic resources, work with a tutor, study on their own, or work with their classmates. Peer tutoring, provided by successful UCC students, is available for most subjects, Monday through Friday. Students can also access online tutoring, available 24/7 through SmarThinking, a resource that allows students to connect with experts in their fields. There are several convenient study spaces, including study rooms for group projects that feature large touch screen monitors, individual study kiosks, couches, a large open study area, and ADA accessible tables. A computer lab with printing services and dedicated Lab Aides are also available. Research librarians can assist with research, and help guide students through the online collection of academic journals, films, books, and other resources. WHO MAY ENROLL?

UCC has an open door policy and admits students in the following categories:

- Graduates from accredited secondary schools.Individuals who have earned the GED
- Certificate of Equivalency or an Adult High School Diploma.
- Non-high school graduates who are 18 years old or over and whose high school class has graduated.
- Individuals who are 16 or 17 years old who are not required to attend high school and who furnish a written Release from Compulsory School Attendance may make application as a special student (ORS 339.030).
- High school juniors or seniors who present written approval from their school officials. (Course load must be approved by both schools.)
- Some programs have special program requirements other than listed above.

Citizens of other countries must meet certain federal immigration and college requirements before admittance to Umpqua Community College. International students can request special application materials from the UCC website. Adult Basic Skills. Students are required to attend an orientation. Non-credit students are not required to submit a formal application.

BUILDING BETTER FUTURES

Plan dashed, Daniel turned to minimum-wage jobs to get by — months turned into years. Tired of the dead-end job life he was living, he found out about the Job Corps while looking for a better job at the Roseburg employment office.

"It was a wise decision to come here," he said. "I'm definitely better off. The vocational training here is great."

A woodworker since the age of 12, Daniel loves to swing a hammer. He chose construction craft labor — a trade where it's done the most. He liked it so much, he decided to stay at Job Corps for another year and work on a second trade. He is getting close to finishing carpentry. Much smaller than when he started, he is also back on track to enlist in the military.

"This is definitely a place to build the future," he said "I have good mentors and role models here. They are putting me on a path for a better future."

Students who complete the program are tracked for one year. Where they work and how much they earn are important. Although many students are from out of the area, many end







CAMPUS MAP




