How to get to UCC

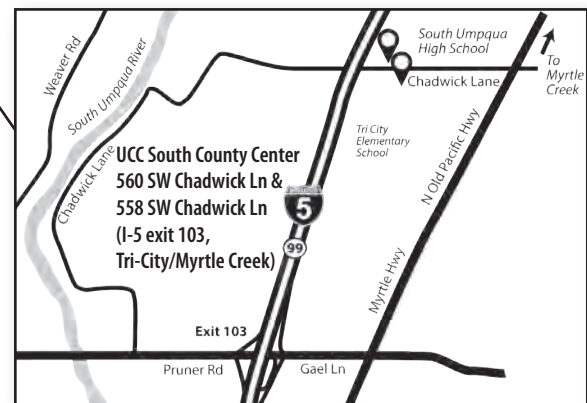
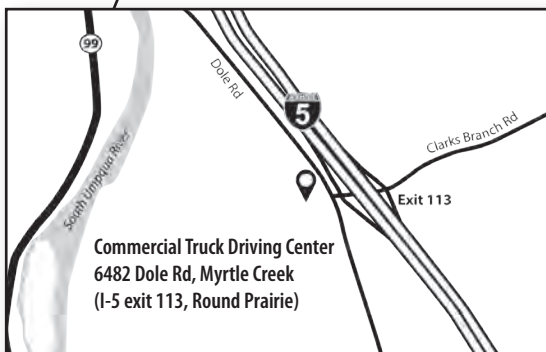

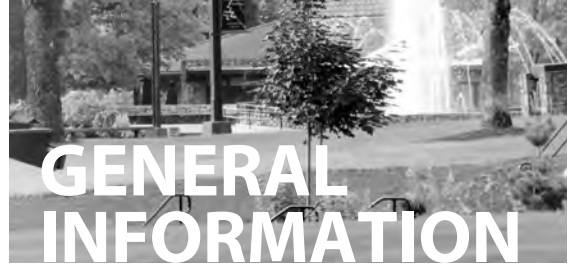

STUDENT FEES

At UCC a student may be required to pay for fees in addition to tuition. Credit classes require some “per credit” fees; term fees are charged each term; and course fees are associated with a specific class.

COURSE FEES

Course fees pay for the materials & supplies associated with the class you are taking (ie: lab supplies for a Science class or liability insurance for Nursing). Some courses are offered as self support and carry a fee amount that is required for course delivery and materials.

CREDIT REGISTRATION FEE

This fee is charged each term to students who enroll in undergraduate credit classes. The proceeds go toward placement testing, degree/certificate application process, academic transcripts, degree verifications, and other record keeping.

INSTRUCTIONAL FEES

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the costs associated with labs and lecture/lab class formats.

LEGACY FEE

The fee will be used to fund new construction on campus and deferred maintenance on existing buildings.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee helps fund the operations of the Student Life office and supports student activities (including athletics). The fee funds the college contract with Umpqua Transit, which provides credit students with a reduced priced bus pass for the term.

STUDENT FEE FOR SUCCESS PROGRAM

Paid by students taking credit classes, this fee supports the Success Center and Peer Mentor program.

STUDENT INSURANCE FEE

This fee covers the premium for accident insurance while students are involved in college classes and activities, or traveling on college business. For more information, contact the Student Life Office at 541-440-7749.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

Provides for the upkeep and renewal of campus technology infrastructure in support of classrooms, computer labs, and campus information systems.

UCC ONLINE & HYBRID CLASS FEES

Fees pay for costs associated with providing students with online courses, including the delivery platform.

ASUCC STUDENT LEADERSHIP

The student leadership team is comprised of both elected and appointed student leaders, who represent student interests and needs to the college administration. ASUCC provides several student support services including: Project CANS (Food Pantry), emergency gas vouchers, subsidized bus passes, backpacks with supplies, hygiene products, clothes closet and the Textbook Reserve. BUS SERVICE

CAMPUS SECURITY POLICY

Campus security coverage is maintained seven days a week. Security staff may be contacted by calling 541-440-7777 or dialing 7777 from any campus extension. In addition to providing a safe working environment, Campus Security enforces traffic and parking regulations, promotes crime prevention and secures the college buildings and facilities. Campus crime information is collected annually and is available upon request.

CANCELLATION OF CLASSES

The college reserves the right to cancel any class because of extenuating circumstances, such as low enrollment.

DIRECTORY INFORMATION

Umpqua Community College defines certain information as "directory information," which may be released to a third party upon written request. Students may sign a *Withhold Directory Information Request* to prevent the release of this information. Students who sign the request will not be listed in news releases concerning honor rolls or in commencement publications.

DROPS / WITHDRAWALS

Students registered for classes are considered to be in attendance. Students discontinuing attendance without filing the official drop/withdrawal form in the Registration Office may receive a failing grade. Recipients of Title IV financial aid are subject to the federal regulations for withdrawals from classes for a term.

Students wishing to drop/delete (which does not appear on the academic transcript) from a course(s) must initiate the withdrawal procedure within the first five instructional days of each term (except for classes less than 10 weeks in length). The appropriate form must be filed in the Registration and Records Office. After five days, the following withdrawal (appears on the academic transcript as a "W") procedures must be followed.

EARLY REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT

Students who register early for a subsequent term(s) must pay the tuition and fees due. Students with no schedule changes may mail or drop off a check (with their name and identification number) in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center by the dates listed for each term.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT/ EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY/ AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

PAYMENT OF TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees for each term may be paid in one of the following ways:

1. Payment in full or online payment plan **by January 7.**
2. Approved Financial Aid.

Registration **AFTER January 7** must be accompanied by payment in full or online payment plan.

Failure to pay may result in being dropped from classes.

Any unpaid debts will be put into the collections process 30 days after the end of the quarter. Appeals may be submitted to the Finance Office.

PLACEMENT ASSESSMENT

The placement assessment is required for all credit students. Walk-in placement testing for Fall, Winter and Spring terms are on Tuesdays from 8:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m., and Thursdays from 10:15 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. in the Educational Skills Building 29. For appointments, call 541-440-7659 for available days and times.

REFUNDS

Credit Tuition Refunds

Students who withdraw from one or more UCC courses and who have complied with regulations governing withdrawals are entitled to certain refunds of tuition depending on the time of withdrawal. Refunds are limited to students who comply with withdrawal procedures.

Consequences for Not Paying

The college may take any or all of the following actions if students fail to pay their accounts:

- Require immediate payment in full
- Block enrollment for future terms
- Decline to provide official transcripts
- Assign accounts to collections for non-payment
- Assign the debt to the Oregon Department of Revenue to offset any refunds or sums due

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), also known as the Buckley Amendment, covers the release and inspection of student educational records.

STUDENT ID CARDS

All registered students are entitled to an ID card that serves as official UCC photo identification. The ID card station is located in the Student Center and is open from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Mon-Fri (Fall, Winter, Spring); 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Mon-Thur (Summer).

Students must show a copy of their current class schedule and other form of photo ID. ID cards must be validated each term. Validation stickers are available at the Information Desk or Student Accounts in the LaVerne Murphy Student Center and at the Reference Desk in the Sue Shaffer Learning Commons & Library.

STUDENT INSURANCE

How do I file a harassment or discrimination complaint? Who can I contact for more information on Title IX issues? When should I file a complaint?

You should file a complaint if you are a student, staff, or faculty member, and believe:

- You are subjected to harassment/discrimination
- You have witnessed harassment/discrimination
- You have knowledge of harassment/discrimination

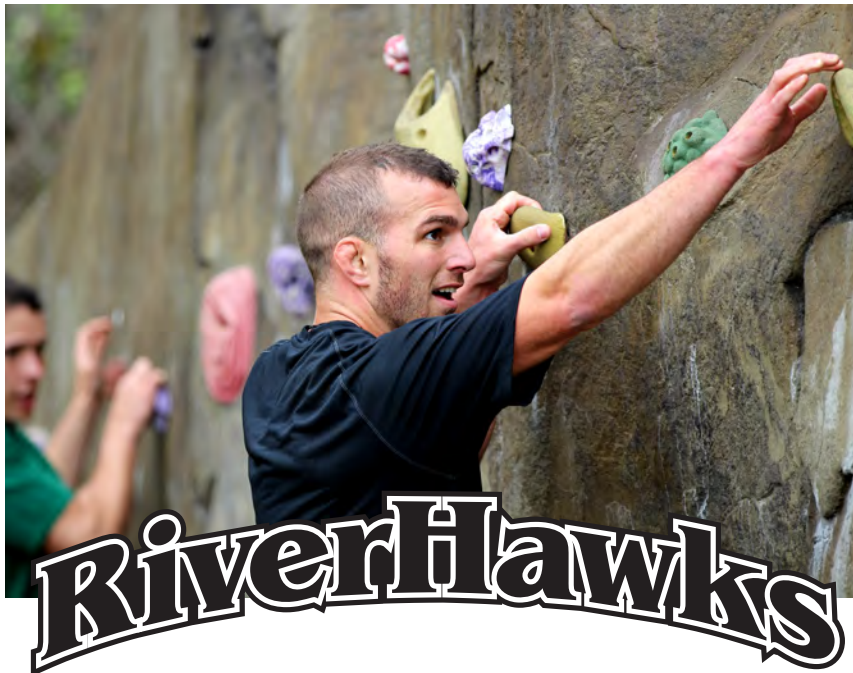

SPOTLIGHT ON STUDENT SUCCESS

CREATING A NEW PATH TO A SECOND CAREER

Without a doubt, Wade Christensen has seen and experienced a lot more than an average college student. Six days after the Glendale native graduated from high school in the early 90s, he left the town where he grew up and enlisted in the U.S. Army. For the next 23 years, he would travel the world as a combat engineer and later become a Special Forces soldier.

"I told people I was getting out of the Army after five years because I didn't want to be an NCO (non-commissioned officer)," he said. "My first sergeant said I could run from my problems or step up and be a leader. I chose to become leader."

Wade reenlisted and was selected to join the Green Berets—making his childhood dream a reality. He spent 18 years jumping out of planes and—in his words—blowing stuff up. He deployed to Afghanistan three times and once to Iraq.

Several years into his military career, he came home to Oregon over a four-day weekend and unexpectedly met his wife. They made their home at Fort Lewis in Washington State where Wade was stationed for the majority of his Army career. While living in Washington, Wade saw a newspaper ad that ultimately changed his life.

"The ad was for the Forestry program at UCC," he said. "I was all set to go to the University of Washington, but we instantly decided to move back home."

In September 2016, the retired veteran began the journey into his second career. He became a part of the first class to start the College's renewed Forestry program.

"Being an older student, I didn't know what to expect when I showed up," he said. "I wasn't a great student in high school. I wanted to be anywhere but school. I always wanted to be outside in the woods."



Wade spent a lot of time around youth in the military. He quickly connected with students more than half his age and started to develop what are now life-long bonds. He credits them, and many UCC instructors and staff, for helping contribute to his success.

"Everyone has been amazing," he said. "It's like a family."

During his time at UCC, Wade continued to be the leader he chose to become. He started the UCC Forestry Club and served as its president. He was an honor society member with a 3.78 grade point average, and also participated in UCC Veterans Club activities.

Wade graduated with an associate of science degree in June. At commencement, he received the Harry Jacoby Award—the highest honor a single UCC graduate can receive. He transferred to Oregon State University in September to study Forest Management: Restoration and Fire.

"I had such a great two years at UCC," he said. "It was such a great experience. When I finish my bachelor's degree, I'm coming back home. This is a community I want to stay in."
